Mr. Speaker:

The Health and Human Services Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.B. 237**, VISION SCREENING AMENDMENTS, by Representative M. Brown, with the following amendments and recommends it be placed on the Consent Calendar.

1. *Page 3, Lines 75 through 85:*

- 75 (7) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (7)(b), a licensed health professional
76 providing vision care to private patients may not participate as a screener in a free vision
77 screening program provided by a school district.
- 78 (b) A school district or charter school may:
- 79 (i) allow a licensed health professional who provides vision care to private patients
to
80 participate as a screener in a free vision screening program for a child {~~nine~~} 3-
1/2 years [~~of age~~] old or
81 older;
- 82 (ii) establish guidelines to administer a free vision screening program described in
83 Subsection (7)(b)(i); and
- 84 (iii) establish penalties for a violation of the requirements of Subsection (7)(c).
