Chair Last called the meeting to order at 8:04 a.m.

H.B. 392 Requirements for Career and Technical Education Teachers (Rep. B. Daw)

Rep. Daw explained the bill to the committee with the assistance of Ms. Amy Christian, teacher.

Dr. Sydnee Dickson, Deputy Superintendent, State Office of Education, spoke to the bill.

Mr. Jay Blaine, Utah Education Association, spoke against the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Eliason moved to move to the next item on the agenda. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Fawson, Rep. Gibson, Rep. Hutchings, and Rep. McCay absent for the vote.

H.B. 360 Utah Education Amendments (Rep. L. Christensen)

Rep. Christensen explained the bill to the committee.

Mr. Brad C. Smith, Superintendent, State Office of Education, spoke to the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Snow moved to replace H.B. 360 with 1st Sub. H.B. 360. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Fawson, Rep. Gibson, and Rep. McCay absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Snow moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 3, Lines 78 through 82:
 - 78 (c) Parents and guardians have the primary responsibility for the education of their
 - 79 <u>children and elect representatives in the Legislature and on state and local school boards</u> to
 - 80 <u>administer the state public education system, which provides extensive support and assistance.</u>
 - 81 All children of the state are entitled to a free education as provided in Utah Constitution,
 - 82 Article X.

The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Fawson, Rep. Gibson, and Rep. McCay absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Snow moved to pass the bill out as amended. The motion passed with Rep. Lifferth voting against the motion. Rep. Fawson, Rep. Gibson, and Rep. McCay were absent for the vote.

H.B. 337 Career and Technical Education Comprehensive Study (Rep. R. Cunningham)

Rep. Cunningham explained the bill to the committee.

Spoke to the Bill: Mr. Brad C. Smith, Superintendent, State Office of Education

Mr. Sterling Brown, Utah Farm Bureau, spoke to the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Hutchings moved to replace H.B. 337 with 1st Sub. H.B. 337. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Gibson and Rep. McCay absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Hutchings moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 2, Line 51 through Page 3, Line 60:
 - 51 <u>executive director of the Governor's Office of Economic Development's designee;</u>
 - 52 {<u>(f) a member of the State Board of Education, chosen by the chair of the State Board of</u>
 - 53 Education;
 - 54 (g) a member of the State Board of Regents, chosen by the chair of the State

 Board of

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- **55** Regents; 56 {_(h)} one member of the governor's staff, appointed by the governor; 57 {-(i)-} (g) <u>five private sector members, representing business or industry that</u> em<u>ploys</u> individuals who hold certificates issued by a CTE program, appointed by the governor; 58 59 (h) a member of the Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate; {-(i)-} and 60 {-(k)-} (i) a member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the speaker of the House 2. *Page 3, Lines 62 through 71:* 62 (2) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2)(b), the governor shall appoint CTE Board members described in Subsection $\{-(1)(i)\}$ (1)(g) to four-year terms. 63 64 (b) The governor shall adjust the initial terms of the members appointed under 65 Subsection $\{\frac{(1)(i)}{(i)}\}$ (1)(g) so that the governor appoints approximately half of the members every two 66 years. 67 (c) A member appointed by the governor under Subsection $\{-(1)(i)\}$ (1)(g)may not serve more than two full consecutive terms unless the governor determines that an additional term or 68 terms is in the state's best interest. <u>69</u> 70 (d) If a vacancy occurs in the membership appointed by the governor under Subsection {-(1)(i)-} (1)(g) for any reason, the governor shall appoint a replacement for the 71 unexpired term. 3. Page 5, Lines 121 through 125: 121 use data collected by the Office of the Legislative Auditor General to complete the study. 122 (3)(a) The State Board of Education, State Board of Regents, and {-(3)-} Utah College of 123 Applied Technology shall: 124 {_(a)} (i) provide data that the department requests for the study; and
 - (ii) coordinate with the department to conduct the study.
 (3)(b) Notwithstanding the requirements in Subsection (3)(a), the board shall have discretion to gather and report information as part of the comprehensive study

of CTE that is readily accessible through current financial and data systems.

H.B. 403 Online Education Survey Program Amendments (Rep. S. Eliason)

- 1. Page 3, Line 88 through Page 4, Line 90:
 - 88 (ii) make available to parents online access to surveys, which they may complete for
 - 89 each of their children's teachers and schools; and
- 90 (iii) make available to teachers online access to a survey of their school, which they The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Gibson, Rep. Hutchings, and Rep. McCay absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Fawson moved to pass the bill out favorably as amended. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Gibson, Rep. Hutchings, and Rep. McCay absent for the vote.

S.B. 114 Board of Education Compensation Amendments *(Sen. A. Osmond)* (Rep. C. Hall)

Sen. Osmond explained the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Lifferth moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Hutchings and Rep. McCay absent for the vote.

S.B. 117 Interventions for Reading Difficulties Pilot Program *(Sen. A. Osmond)* (Rep. F. Gibson)

Sen. Osmond explained the bill to the committee with the assistance of Ms. Karee Atkinson, President, Decoding Dyslexia Utah, along with a PowerPoint presentation, "Interventions for Reading Difficulties."

MOTION: Rep. Poulson moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously.

S.B. 196 Math Competency Initiative (Sen. A. Millner) (Rep.)
