Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section <b>53A-17a-156</b> is amended to read:
53A-17a-156. Teacher Salary Supplement Program Appeal process.
(1) As used in this section:

29	(b) "Eligible teacher" means a teacher who:

94	(3) (a) The annual salary supplement for an eligible teacher who is assigned full time to
95	teach one or more courses listed in Subsections (1)(b)(i)(A) through (E) is \$4,100.
96	(b) An eligible teacher who has a part-time assignment to teach one or more courses
97	listed in Subsections (1)(b)(i)(A) through (E) shall receive a partial salary supplement based on
98	the number of hours worked in [a] the course assignment [that meets the requirements of
99	Subsections (1)(b)(ii) and (iii)].
100	(4) The board shall:
101	(a) create an online application system for a teacher to apply to receive a salary
102	supplement through the Teacher Salary Supplement Program;
103	(b) determine if a teacher:
104	(i) is an eligible teacher; and
105	(ii) has a course assignment as listed in Subsections (1)(b)(i)(A) through (E); and
106	(c) verify, as needed, the determinations made under Subsection (4)(b) with school
107	district and school administrators.
108	(5) (a) An eligible teacher shall apply with the board before the conclusion of a school

135	(2)(b) in the amount of each salary supplement.
136	(c) The employer-paid benefits described under Subsection (2)(b) are an addition to the
137	salary supplement limits described under Subsection (3).
138	(8) (a) Money received from the Teacher Salary Supplement Restricted Account shall
139	be used by a school district or charter school to provide a salary supplement equal to the
140	amount specified in Subsection (3) for each eligible teacher.
141	(b) The salary supplement is part of the teacher's base pay, subject to the teacher's
142	qualification as an eligible teacher every year, semester, or trimester.
143	(9) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, if the appropriation for the program
144	is insufficient to cover the costs associated with salary supplements, the board may limit or

reduce the salary supplements.
