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8   **LONG TITLE**

9   **Committee Note:**

10           The Executive Appropriations Committee recommended this bill.

11   **General Description:**

12           This bill appropriates funds for the support and operation of state government for the fiscal  
13 year beginning July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017.

14   **Highlighted Provisions:**

15           This bill:

- 16           ▶ provides appropriations for the use and support of certain state agencies;
- 17           ▶ provides appropriations for other purposes as described.

18   **Money Appropriated in this Bill:**

19           This bill appropriates \$298,890,000 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2017,  
20 including:

- 21           ▶ \$95,413,000 from the General Fund;
- 22           ▶ \$21,037,000 from the Education Fund;
- 23           ▶ \$182,440,000 from various sources as detailed in this bill.

24           This bill appropriates \$22,363,300 in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2017.

25           This bill appropriates \$15,555,000 in restricted fund and account transfers for fiscal year  
26 2017, all of which is from the General Fund.

27           This bill appropriates \$11,021,400 in fiduciary funds for fiscal year 2017.

28   **Other Special Clauses:**

29           This bill takes effect on July 1, 2016.

34 Section 1. **FY 2017 Appropriations.** The following sums of money are appropriated for the

37 Utah Code Title 63J, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or
