

Section 1. Section 15A-1-204 is amended to read:

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26	15A-1-204. Adoption of State Construction Code Amendments by commission
27	Approved codes Exemptions.
28	(1) (a) The State Construction Code is the construction codes adopted with any
29	modifications in accordance with this section that the state and each political subdivision of the
30	state shall follow.
31	(b) A person shall comply with the applicable provisions of the State Construction
32	Code when:
33	(i) new construction is involved; and
34	(ii) the owner of an existing building, or the owner's agent, is voluntarily engaged in:
35	(A) the repair, renovation, remodeling, alteration, enlargement, rehabilitation,
36	conservation, or reconstruction of the building; or
37	(B) changing the character or use of the building in a manner that increases the
38	occupancy loads, other demands, or safety risks of the building.
39	(c) On and after July 1, 2010, the State Construction Code is the State Construction
40	Code in effect on July 1, 2010, until in accordance with this section:
41	(i) a new State Construction Code is adopted; or
42	(ii) one or more provisions of the State Construction Code are amended or repealed in
43	accordance with this section.
44	(d) A provision of the State Construction Code may be applicable:
45	(i) to the entire state; or
46	(ii) within a county, city, or town.
47	(2) (a) The Legislature shall adopt a State Construction Code by enacting legislation
48	that adopts a construction code with any modifications.
49	(b) Legislation enacted under this Subsection (2) shall state that it takes effect on the
50	July 1 after the day on which the legislation is enacted, unless otherwise stated in the
51	legislation.
52	(c) Subject to Subsection (5), a State Construction Code adopted by the Legislature is
53	the State Construction Code until, in accordance with this section, the Legislature adopts a new
54	State Construction Code by:
55	(i) adopting a new State Construction Code in its entirety; or
56	(ii) amending or repealing one or more provisions of the State Construction Code.

57	(3) (a) The commission shall by no later than November 30 of each year recommend to
58	the Business and Labor Interim Committee whether the Legislature should:
59	(i) amend or repeal one or more provisions of a State Construction Code; or
60	(ii) in a year of a regularly scheduled update of a nationally recognized code, adopt a
61	construction code with any modifications.
62	(b) The commission may recommend legislative action related to the State
63	Construction Code:
64	(i) on its own initiative;
65	(ii) upon the recommendation of the division; or
66	(iii) upon the receipt of a request by one of the following that the commission
67	recommend legislative action related to the State Construction Code:
68	(A) a local regulator;
69	(B) a state regulator;
70	(C) a state agency involved with the construction and design of a building;
71	(D) the Construction Services Commission;
72	(E) the Electrician Licensing Board;
73	(F) the Plumbers Licensing Board; or
74	(G) a recognized construction-related association.
75	(4) If the Business and Labor Interim Committee decides to recommend legislative
76	action to the Legislature, the Business and Labor Interim Committee shall prepare legislation
77	for consideration by the Legislature in the next general session that, if passed by the
78	Legislature, would:
79	(a) adopt a new State Construction Code in its entirety; or
80	(b) amend or repeal one or more provisions of the State Construction Code.
81	(5) (a) Notwithstanding Subsection (3), the commission may, in accordance with Title
82	63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, amend the State Construction Code if
83	the commission determines that waiting for legislative action in the next general legislative
84	session would:
85	(i) cause an imminent peril to the public health, safety, or welfare; or
86	(ii) place a person in violation of federal or other state law.
87	(b) If the commission amends the State Construction Code in accordance with this

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- 88 Subsection (5), the commission shall file with the division: 89 (i) the text of the amendment to the State Construction Code; and 90 (ii) an analysis that includes the specific reasons and justifications for the commission's 91 findings. 92 (c) If the State Construction Code is amended under this Subsection (5), the division 93 shall: 94 (i) publish the amendment to the State Construction Code in accordance with Section 95 15A-1-205; and 96 (ii) notify the Business and Labor Interim Committee of the amendment to the State 97 Construction Code, including a copy of the commission's analysis described in Subsection 98 (5)(b). 99 (d) If not formally adopted by the Legislature at its next annual general session, an 100 amendment to the State Construction Code under this Subsection (5) is repealed on the July 1 101 immediately following the next annual general session that follows the adoption of the 102 amendment. 103 (6) (a) The division, in consultation with the commission, may approve, without 104 adopting, one or more approved codes, including a specific edition of a construction code, for 105 use by a compliance agency. 106 (b) If the code adopted by a compliance agency is an approved code described in 107 Subsection (6)(a), the compliance agency may: 108 (i) adopt an ordinance requiring removal, demolition, or repair of a building; 109 (ii) adopt, by ordinance or rule, a dangerous building code; or 110 (iii) adopt, by ordinance or rule, a building rehabilitation code. 111 (7) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (7)(b), a structure used solely in conjunction 112 with agriculture use, and not for human occupancy, is exempt from the permit requirements of 113 the State Construction Code.
  - (b) (i) Unless exempted by a provision other than Subsection (7)(a), a plumbing, electrical, and mechanical permit may be required when that work is included in a structure described in Subsection (7)(a).
  - (ii) Unless located in whole or in part in an agricultural protection area created under Title 17, Chapter 41, Agriculture and Industrial Protection Areas, a structure described in

119	Subsection (7)(a) is not exempt from a permit requirement if the structure is located on land
120	that is:
121	(A) within the boundaries of a city or town, and less than five contiguous acres; or
122	(B) within a subdivision for which the county has approved a subdivision plat under
123	Title 17, Chapter 27a, Part 6, Subdivisions, and less than two contiguous acres.
124	[(8) A structure that is no more than 1,000 square feet and is used solely for the type of
125	sales described in Subsection 59-12-104(20) is exempt from the permit requirements described
126	in:]
127	[(a) Chapter 2, Adoption of State Construction Code;]
128	[(b) Chapter 3, Statewide Amendments Incorporated as Part of State Construction
129	Code; and]
130	[(c) Chapter 4, Local Amendments Incorporated as Part of State Construction Code.]
131	Section 2. Section <b>15A-3-102</b> is amended to read:
132	15A-3-102. Amendments to Chapters 1 through 3 of IBC.
133	(1) IBC, Section 106, is deleted.
134	(2) (a) In IBC, Section 110, a new section is added as follows: "110.3.5,
135	Weather-resistant exterior wall envelope. An inspection shall be made of the weather-resistant
136	exterior wall envelope as required by Section 1403.2, and flashing as required by Section
137	1405.4 to prevent water from entering the weather-resistive barrier."
138	(b) The remaining sections of IBC, Section 110, are renumbered as follows: 110.3.6,
139	Lath or gypsum board inspection; 110.3.7, Fire- and smoke-resistant penetrations; 110.3.8,
140	Energy efficiency inspections; 110.3.9, Other inspections; 110.3.10, Special inspections; and
141	110.3.11, Final inspection.
142	(3) IBC, Section 115.1, is deleted and replaced with the following: "115.1 Authority.
143	Whenever the building official finds any work regulated by this code being performed in a
144	manner either contrary to the provisions of this code or other pertinent laws or ordinances or is
145	dangerous or unsafe, the building official is authorized to stop work."
146	(4) In IBC, Section 202, the following definition is added for Ambulatory Surgical
147	Center: "AMBULATORY SURGICAL CENTER. A building or portion of a building licensed
148	by the Utah Department of Health where procedures are performed that may render patients
149	incapable of self preservation where care is less than 24 hours. See Utah Administrative Code

- 150 R432-13."
- 151 (5) In IBC, Section 202, the definition for Foster Care Facilities is modified by changing the word "Foster" to "Child."
- 153 (6) In IBC, Section 202, the definition for "[F]Record Drawings" is modified by
- deleting the words "a fire alarm system" and replacing them with "any fire protection system".
- 155 (7) In IBC, Section 202, the following definition is added for Residential
- 156 Treatment/Support Assisted Living Facility: "RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT/SUPPORT
- 157 ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY. See Section 308.1.2."
- 158 (8) In IBC, Section 202, the following definition is added for Type I Assisted Living
- 159 Facility: "TYPE I ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY. See Section 308.1.2."
- 160 (9) In IBC, Section 202, the following definition is added for Type II Assisted Living
- 161 Facility: "TYPE II ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY. See Section 308.1.2."
- 162 (10) In the list in IBC, Section 304.1, the following words are added after the words
- 163 "Ambulatory care facilities": "where four or more care recipients are rendered incapable of self
- 164 preservation."
- 165 (11) In IBC, Section 305.2, the words "child care centers," are inserted after the word
- "supervision," and the following sentence is added at the end of the paragraph: "See Section
- 167 425 for special requirements for Day Care."
- 168 (12) In IBC, Section 305.2.2 and 305.2.3, the word "five" is deleted and replaced with
- the word "four" in both places.
- 170 (13) A new IBC Section 305.2.4 is added as follows: "305.2.4 Child Day Care --
- 171 Residential Certificate or a Family License. Areas used for child day care purposes with a
- 172 Residential Certificate R430-50 or a Family License, as defined in Utah Administrative Code,
- 173 R430-90, Licensed Family Child Care, may be located in a Group R-2 or R-3 occupancy as
- provided in Section 310.5 or shall comply with the International Residential Code in
- accordance with Section R101.2."
- 176 (14) A new IBC Section 305.2.5 is added as follows: "305.2.5 Child Care Centers.
- Areas used for Hourly Child Care Centers, as defined in Utah Administrative Code, R430-60,
- 178 Child Care Center as defined in Utah Administrative Code, R430-100, or Out of School Time
- 179 Programs, as defined in Utah Administrative Code, R430-70, may be classified as accessory
- 180 occupancies."

- 181 (15) A new IBC Section 308.2.1 is added as follows: "308.2.1 Assisted living facilities
- and related occupancies. The following words and terms shall, for the purposes of this section
- and as used elsewhere in this code, have the meanings shown herein.
- 184 TYPE I ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY. A residential facility licensed by the Utah
- Department of Health that provides a protected living arrangement for ambulatory,
- non-restrained persons who are capable of achieving mobility sufficient to exit the facility
- without the assistance of another person.
- Occupancies. Limited capacity, type I assisted living facilities with two to five residents shall
- be classified as R-3 occupancies. Small, type I assisted living facilities with six to sixteen
- residents shall be classified as R-4 occupancies. Large, type I assisted living facilities with
- over sixteen residents shall be classified as I-1 occupancies.
- 192 TYPE II ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY. A residential facility licensed by the Utah
- 193 Department of Health that provides an array of coordinated supportive personal and health care
- services to residents who meet the definition of semi-independent.
- 195 Semi-Independent. A person who is:
- 196 A. Physically disabled but able to direct his or her own care; or
- B. Cognitively impaired or physically disabled but able to evacuate from the facility with the
- 198 physical assistance of one person.
- Occupancies. Limited capacity, type II assisted living facilities with two to five residents shall
- be classified as R-4 occupancies. Small, type II assisted living facilities with six to sixteen
- 201 residents shall be classified as I-1 occupancies. Large, type II assisted living facilities with
- over sixteen residents shall be classified as I-2 occupancies.
- 203 RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT/SUPPORT ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY. A residential
- treatment/support assisted living facility which creates a group living environment for four or
- 205 more residents licensed by the Utah Department of Human Services, and provides a protected
- 206 living arrangement for ambulatory, non-restrained persons who are capable of achieving
- 207 mobility sufficient to exit the facility without the physical assistance of another person."
- 208 (16) In IBC, Section 308.3, the words "(see Section 308.2.1)" are added after the
- words "assisted living facilities".
- 210 (17) In IBC, Section 308.3.1, all of the words after the first International Residential
- 211 Code are deleted.

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- 212 (18) In IBC, Section 308.4, the following changes are made:
- 213 (a) The words "five persons" are deleted and replaced with the words "three persons."
- 214 (b) The words "foster care facilities" are deleted and replaced with "child care facilities."
- 216 (c) The words "(both intermediate care facilities and skilled nursing facilities)" are added after "nursing homes."
- 218 (d) The words "Ambulatory Surgical Centers with five or more operating rooms" are 219 added to the list.
- 220 (19) In IBC, Section 308.4.1, the word "five" is deleted and replaced with the word 221 "three" in both places.
- 222 (20) In IBC, Section 308.6, the word "five" is deleted and replaced with the word 223 "four".
- 224 (21) In IBC, Section 308.6.1, the following changes are made:
  - (a) The word "five" is deleted and replaced with the word "four".
- 226 (b) The words "2-1/2 years or less of age" are deleted and replaced with "under the age 227 of two".
  - (c) The following sentence is added at the end: "See Section 425 for special requirements for Day Care."
  - (22) In IBC, Sections 308.6.3 and 308.6.4, the word "five" is deleted and replaced with the word "four" in both places and the following sentence is added at the end: "See Section 425 for special requirements for Day Care."
- 233 (23) In IBC, Section 310.5, the words "and single family dwellings complying with the IRC" are added after "Residential occupancies".
- 235 (24) In IBC, Section 310.5.1, the words "other than Child Care" are inserted after the 236 word "dwelling" in the first sentence and the following sentence is added at the end: "See 237 Section 425 for special requirements for Child Day Care."
- 238 (25) A new IBC Section 310.5.2 is added as follows: "310.5.2 Child Care. Areas used 239 for child care purposes may be located in a residential dwelling unit under all of the following 240 conditions and Section 425:
- 1. Compliance with Utah Administrative Code, R710-8, Day Care Rules, as enacted under the authority of the Utah Fire Prevention Board.

- 243 2. Use is approved by the Utah Department of Health, as enacted under the authority of the
- 244 Utah Code, Title 26, Chapter 39, Utah Child Care Licensing Act, and in any of the following
- 245 categories:
- a. Utah Administrative Code, R430-50, Residential Certificate Child Care.
- b. Utah Administrative Code, R430-90, Licensed Family Child Care.
- 248 3. Compliance with all zoning regulations of the local regulator."
- 249 (26) In IBC, Section 310.6, the words "(see Section 308.2.1)" are added after "assisted living facilities".
- 251 (27) In IBC, Section 312.1, the words "Structures intended for no more than 50
- occupants that are used solely for the type of sales described in Subsection 59-12-104(20)" are
- added after "Stables".
- Section 3. Section **15A-3-105** is amended to read:
- 255 15A-3-105. Amendments to Chapters 10 through 12 of IBC.
- (1) In IBC, Section 1008.1.9.6, the words "Group I-1 and" are added in the title and in
- 257 the first sentence before the words "Group I-2" and a new number 8 is added as follows: "8.
- The secure area or unit with special egress locks shall be located at the level of exit discharge
- 259 in Type V construction."
- 260 (2) In IBC, Section 1008.1.9.7, a new number 7 is added as follows: "7. The secure
- area or unit with delayed egress locks shall be located at the level of exit discharge in Type V
- 262 construction."
- 263 (3) In IBC, Section 1009.7.2, exception 5 is deleted and replaced with the following:
- 264 "5. In Group R-3 occupancies, within dwelling units in Group R-2 occupancies, and in Group
- U occupancies that are accessory to a Group R-3 occupancy, or accessory to individual
- 266 dwelling units in Group R-2 occupancies, the maximum riser height shall be 8 inches (203
- 267 mm) and the minimum tread depth shall be 9 inches (229 mm). The minimum winder tread
- depth at the walk line shall be 10 inches (254 mm), and the minimum winder tread depth shall
- be 6 inches (152 mm). A nosing not less than 0.75 inch (19.1 mm) but not more than 1.25
- inches (32 mm) shall be provided on stairways with solid risers where the tread depth is less
- 271 than 10 inches (254 mm)."
- 272 (4) In IBC, Section 1009.15, a new exception 6 is added as follows: "6. In occupancies
- in Group R-3, as applicable in Section 101.2 and in occupancies in Group U, which are

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274	accessory to an occupancy in Group R-3, as applicable in Section 101.2, handrails shall be
275	provided on at least one side of stairways consisting of four or more risers."
276	(5) In IBC, Section 1011.5, the words ", including when the building may not be fully
277	occupied." are added at the end of the sentence.
278	(6) IBC, Section 1024, is deleted.
279	(7) In IBC, Section 1028.12, exception 2 is deleted.
280	(8) In IBC, Section 1103.2.4, add exception 3 as follows:
281	"3. A structure intended for no more than 50 occupants that is used solely for the type
282	of sales described in Subsection 59-12-104(20)."
283	[(8)] (9) In IBC, Section 1109.8, the following words "shall be capable of operation
284	without a key and" are inserted in the second sentence between the words "lift" and "shall".
285	[(9)] (10) In IBC, Section 1208.4, subparagraph 1 is deleted and replaced with the
286	following: "1. The unit shall have a living room of not less than 165 square feet (15.3 m²) of
287	floor area. An additional 100 square feet (9.3 m²) of floor area shall be provided for each
288	occupant of such unit in excess of two."
