Mr. Speaker:

The Education Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.B. 182**, CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT EDUCATION AMENDMENTS, by Representative V. Peterson, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 6, Lines 154 through 176:
 - 154 <u>53A-15-1705.</u> Concurrent enrollment { <u>application</u> } <u>participation form</u> -- { <u>Student acknowledgment and</u>
 - 155 parental Parental permission.
 - 156 (1) The State Board of Regents shall create a higher education concurrent enrollment
 - 157 { <u>application</u>} <u>participation form</u> that includes { <u>an acknowledgment form</u> and } a parental permission form.
 - 158 {<u>(2) An institution of higher education shall use the application described in Subsection</u>
 - 159 (1) for eligible students to participate in concurrent enrollment.
 - 160 {(3)} (2) Before allowing an eligible student to participate in concurrent enrollment, an LEA
 - and an institution of higher education shall ensure that the eligible student has, for the current
 - school year:
 - 163 (a) submitted the { application } participation form described in Subsection (1);







- (b) signed an acknowledgment of program participation requirements; and
- (c) obtained parental permission as indicated by the signature of a student's parent or
- legal guardian on the parental permission form.
- Section 6. Section **53A-15-1706** is enacted to read:
- 168 <u>53A-15-1706.</u> Tuition and fees.
- (1) Except as provided in this section, the State Board of Regents or an institution of
- higher education may not charge tuition or fees for a concurrent enrollment course.
- 171 (2) (a) The State Board of Regents may charge a one-time fee for a student to {apply to}
- 172 participate in the concurrent enrollment program.
- 173 (3) A student who pays a fee described in Subsection (2) (a) does not satisfy a general
- admission application fee requirement for a full-time or part-time student at an institution of
- higher education.
 - (3) (a) An institution of higher education may charge a one-time admission application fee for concurrent enrollment course credit offered by the institution of higher education.
 - (b) Payment of the fee described in Subsection (3)(a) satisfies the general admission application fee requirement for a full-time or part-time student at an institution of higher education.
- 176 (4) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (4)(b), an institution of higher education may
