MOTION: Rep. Hall moved to approve the minutes of February 24, 2016, February 26, 2016,

S.B. 203 Immunity Amendments (J. S. Adams)

Rep. Oda, House sponsor for the bill, explained the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Snow moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 5, Lines 134 through 138:
 - 134 (3) A person or {business} entity owning a building or other facility and an operator of or
 - an employee in a building or facility is immune from liability with respect to any decisions or
 - actions related to emergency or public health conditions, as described in Subsection
 - 137 <u>63G-7-201(2)(c)</u>, while acting under the general supervision of or on behalf of any public

138 entity.

The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Stratton absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Snow moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed with Rep. King voting in opposition and Rep. Stratton absent for the vote.

S.B. 209 Fifth District Court Judge (S. Urquhart)

Rep. Snow, House sponsor for the bill, explained the bill to the committee with the assistance of Rick Schwermer, Administrative Office of the Courts.

MOTION: Rep. King moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Stratton absent for the vote.

2nd Sub. S.B. 155 Indigent Defense Commission (T. Weiler)

Senator Weiler explained the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. King moved to replace 2nd Sub. S.B. 155 with 5th Sub. S.B.155. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Stratton absent for the vote.

1st Sub. S.B. 213 Small Claims Court Amendments (T. Weiler)

Senator Weiler explained the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Cutler moved to replace 1st Sub. S.B. 213 with 2nd Sub. S.B. 213. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Cox, Rep. Greene, and Rep. King absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Cutler moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Cox, Rep. Greene, and Rep. King absent for the vote.

S.B. 252 Joint Tenancy Amendments (C. Bramble)

Senator Bramble explained the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Cutler moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 2, Lines 28 through 32:
 - 28 (1) (a) (i) [Beginning on May 5, 1997, every] Every ownership interest in real estate
 - granted to two persons in their own right who are designated as husband and wife { ... wife and
 - 30 <u>husband, married, or a married couple</u>} in the granting documents is presumed to be a joint
 - tenancy interest with rights of survivorship, unless severed, converted, or expressly declared in
 - 32 the grant to be otherwise.

MOTION: Rep. Nelson moved to pass the bill as amended. The motion passed with Rep. Cox, Rep. Greene, and Rep. King absent for the vote.

1st Sub. S.B. 111 Guardianship - Right of Association (T. Weiler)

Senator Weiler explained the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Nelson moved to amend the bill. The motion failed with Rep. Oda and Rep. Nelson voting in favor and with Rep. Cox, Rep. Green, and Rep. King absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Christensen moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 2, Lines 50 through 53:
 - (c) A guardian may give any consents or approvals that may be necessary to enable the
 - ward to receive medical or other professional care, counsel, treatment, or service.
 - 52 (d) A guardian may not unreasonably restrict visitation with the ward by family, relatives, or friends.
 - {(d)} (e) If no conservator for the estate of the ward has been appointed, the guardian may:
 - (i) institute proceedings to compel any person under a duty to support the ward or to

 - 63 needs.
 - 64 {(e)} (i) A guardian is required to report the condition of the ward and of the estate which
 - has been subject to the guardian's possession or control, as required by the court or court rule.

 - 95 Subsection [(2)] (3) {(e)} If a fee is paid for an accounting of an estate, no fee shall be charged

 - persons" means those persons required to receive notice in guardianship proceedings as set
 - 109 forth in Section 75-5-309.
 - 110 {-(f)} (g) If a conservator has been appointed, all of the ward's estate received by the guardian
