Representative Marc K. Roberts proposes the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 11 through 17:
  - 11 This bill:
  - 12 amends bee raising registration requirements;
    - addresses mosqito abatement district liability;
  - amends county bee inspector duties;
  - → modifies inspection provisions;
  - provides for bee raising restrictions under certain circumstances;
  - prohibits a political subdivision from adopting an ordinance, rule, regulation, or
  - resolution prohibiting a property owner from establishing or maintaining { an apiary } certain apiaries ;
- 2. Page 3, Lines 63 through 64:
  - 63 <u>registration</u> on or before December 31 of each year.
    - (2) A mosquito abatement district, subject to the provisions of Chapter 2a, Part 7, Mosquito Abatement District Act, is not liable for damages to a beekeeper for bees damaged as a result of an aerosol spray applied to reduce a mosqito population.
  - $\{(2)\}$  (a) A person may not operate a wax-salvage plant without a license issued by the

  - 178 <u>4-11-18.</u> Prohibition of beekeeping by a political subdivision.
  - 179 {A} (1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), a political subdivision may not adopt an ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution
  - prohibiting a property owner from establishing or maintaining an apiary on the property
  - owner's property.
    - (2) A political subdivision may adopt an ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution prohibiting a person from locating an apiary of migratory bees within the boundaries of the political subdivision.
