Prayer given by Representative Don Ipson. Pledge of Allegiance led by Representative Brad Last.

**MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS**

Speaker Hughes appointed Sandy D. Tenney as Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives for the 2016 Third Special Session of the 61st Legislature.

The Chief Clerk, Sandy D. Tenney, read the following:

**PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, since the adjournment of the 2016 General Session of the Sixty-first Legislature of the State of Utah, certain matters have arisen which require immediate legislative attention; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Utah provides that the Governor may, by proclamation, convene the Legislature into Special Session;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Gary R. Herbert, Governor of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Utah, do by this Proclamation call the Sixty-first Legislature of the State of Utah into a Third Special Session at the Utah State Capitol, in Salt Lake City, Utah, on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of May 2016, at 3:00 p.m., for the following purposes:

1. An appropriation of funds and related legislation for the purpose of constructing an arena at the State Fair Park;

2. Legislation related to the use of unmanned aircrafts over restricted wildfire airspaces;
3. Legislation related to the Utah Justice Reinvestment Initiative;
4. Amendments to the code provisions regarding Judicial Nominating Commissions;
5. Legislation related to the ability of grandparents to visit grandchildren adopted by a family member of the child;
6. A clarification to the statutory exception to the warrant requirement for access to the controlled substance database by probation or parole officers;
7. To consider economic development legislation that would provide certain sales and use tax exemptions for a qualifying enterprise data center;
8. Amendments to the code provisions regarding continuing care retirement communities;
9. Legislation related to the Legislature's review of tax credits, similar to 2016 House Bill 310, Tax Credit Review Amendments; and
10. For the Senate to consent to appointments made by the Governor.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS**

Roll call showed all members present except Representatives Johnny Anderson, Keith Grover, Paul Ray, and Lowry Snow, excused.

Speaker Hughes announced that pursuant to Joint Rule 2-1-101, the Rules adopted by the Legislature during the 2106 Second Session apply to the conduct of the House during the 2016 Third Special Session.

The Speaker appointed Representatives Brad Dee, Sophia DiCaro, and Lynn Hemingway as a committee to meet with a like committee from the Senate to wait upon the Governor to inform him that the Legislature is organized and ready to receive any communication or message he may have to offer.

The Speaker appointed Representatives Jeremy Peterson, Jon Stanard, and Rebecca Chavez-Houck as a committee to notify the Senate to inform that Honorable Body that the House is organized and ready to do business.

On motion of Representative Dunnigan, as allowed by the Utah Constitution and the Joint Rules of the Legislature, the House voted to continue its practice of reading only the short title of bills and resolutions as they are introduced or considered on a House Calendar and not read the long title of the bills and resolutions unless a majority of the House directs the reading of the long title, short title, or both of any House or Senate bill or resolution.

On motion of Representative King, the House voted to suspend the rule requiring that bills and resolutions remain on a calendar for one legislative day between second and third readings and that the House also suspends the House Rule requiring a favorable recommendation from a House Standing Committee prior to passage of bills and resolutions.

Representative Dee reported that his committee has waited upon the Governor and informed him that the Legislature is organized and ready to do business.

Representative J. Peterson reported that his committee has waited upon the Senate and they are organized and ready to do business.

Senators Weiler, Mayne, and Milner formally notified the House of Representatives that the Senate is organized and ready to do business.
