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49	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:	
50	Section 1. Section 26-4-28.5 is enacted to read:	
51	26-4-28.5. Psychological autopsy examiner.	
52	(1) With funds appropriated by the Legislature for this purpose, the department shall	
53	provide compensation, at a standard rate determined by the department, to a psychological	
54	autopsy examiner.	
55	(2) The psychological autopsy examiner shall:	
56	(a) work with the medical examiner to compile data regarding suicide related deaths;	

57	(b) as relatives of the deceased are willing, gather information from relatives of the
58	deceased regarding the psychological reasons for the decedent's death;
59	(c) maintain a database of information described in Subsections (2)(a) and (b);
60	(d) in accordance with all applicable privacy laws subject to approval by the
61	department, share the database described in Subsection (2)(c) with the University of Utah
62	Department of Psychiatry or other university-based departments conducting research on
63	suicide;
64	(e) coordinate no less than monthly with the suicide prevention coordinator described
65	in Subsection 62A-15-1101(2); and
66	(f) coordinate no less than quarterly with the state suicide prevention coalition.
67	Section 2. Section 53A-15-1303 is enacted to read:
68	53A-15-1303. Grant awards for elementary programs.
69	(1) To foster peer-to-peer suicide prevention, resiliency, and anti-bullying programs in
70	elementary schools, the public education suicide prevention coordinator, described in Section
71	53A-15-301, shall, subject to legislative appropriations, award grants to elementary schools.
72	(2) A grant award may not exceed \$500 per school per year.
73	(3) The application for a grant shall contain:
74	(a) a requested award amount;
75	(b) a budget; and
76	(c) a narrative plan of the peer-to-peer suicide prevention, resiliency, or anti-bullying
77	program.
78	(4) When awarding a grant under this section, the public education suicide prevention
79	coordinator shall consider:
80	(a) the content of a grant application; and
81	(b) whether an application is submitted in the manner and form prescribed.
82	Section 3. Section 62A-15-1101 is amended to read:
83	62A-15-1101. Suicide prevention Reporting requirements.
84	(1) As used in the section:

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85	(a) "Bureau" means the Bureau of Criminal Identification created in Section 53-10-201
86	within the Department of Public Safety.
87	(b) "Division" means the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health.
88	(c) "Intervention" means an effort to prevent a person from attempting suicide.
89	(d) "Postvention" means mental health intervention after a suicide attempt or death to
90	prevent or contain contagion.
91	(e) "State suicide prevention coordinator" means an individual designated by the
92	division as described in Subsections (2) and (3).
93	(2) The division shall appoint a state suicide prevention coordinator to administer a
94	state suicide prevention program composed of suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention
95	programs, services, and efforts.
96	(3) The state suicide prevention program may include the following components:
97	(a) delivery of resources, tools, and training to community-based coalitions;
98	(b) evidence-based suicide risk assessment tools and training;
99	(c) town hall meetings for building community-based suicide prevention strategies;
100	(d) suicide prevention gatekeeper training;
101	(e) training to identify warning signs and to manage an at-risk individual's crisis;
102	(f) evidence-based intervention training;
103	(g) intervention skills training; and
104	(h) postvention training.
105	(4) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall coordinate with the following to
106	gather statistics, among other duties:
107	(a) local mental health and substance abuse authorities;
108	(b) the State Board of Education, including the public education suicide prevention
109	coordinator described in Section 53A-15-1301;
110	(c) the Department of Health;
111	(d) health care providers, including emergency rooms;
112	(e) federal agencies, including the Federal Bureau of Investigation;

113	(f) other unbiased sources; and
114	(g) other public health suicide prevention efforts.
115	(5) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall provide a written report to the Health
116	and Human Services Interim Committee, by the October meeting every year, on:
117	(a) implementation of the state suicide prevention program, as described in Subsections
118	(2) and (3);
119	(b) data measuring the effectiveness of each component of the state suicide prevention
120	program;
121	(c) funds appropriated for each component of the state suicide prevention program; and
122	(d) five-year trends of suicides in Utah, including subgroups of youths and adults and
123	other subgroups identified by the state suicide prevention coordinator.
124	(6) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall report to the Legislature's:
125	(a) Education Interim Committee, by the October 2015 meeting, jointly with the State
126	Board of Education, on the coordination of suicide prevention programs and efforts with the
127	State Board of Education and the public education suicide prevention coordinator as described
128	in Section 53A-15-1301; and
129	(b) Health and Human Services Interim Committee, by the October 2017 meeting,
130	statistics on the number of annual suicides in Utah, including how many suicides were
131	committed with a gun, and if so:
132	(i) where the victim procured the gun and if the gun was legally possessed by the
133	victim;
134	(ii) if the victim purchased the gun legally and whether a background check was
135	performed before the victim purchased the gun;
136	(iii) whether the victim had a history of mental illness or was under the treatment of a
137	mental health professional;
138	(iv) whether any medication or illegal drugs or alcohol were also involved in the

(v) if the suicide incident also involved the injury or death of another individual,

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141	whether the shooter had a history of domestic violence.		
142	(7) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall consult with the bureau to implement		
143	and manage the operation of a firearm safety program, as described in Subsection		
144	53-10-202(18) and Section 53-10-202.1.		
145	(8) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the		
146	division shall make rules governing the implementation of the state suicide prevention		
147	program, consistent with this section.		
148	(9) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall present to the Health and Human		
149	Services Interim Committee, no later than November 2017, a 10-year statewide suicide		
150	prevention plan.		
151	(10) As funding by the Legislature allows, the state suicide prevention coordinator		
152	shall award grants, not to exceed a total of \$100,000 per fiscal year, to suicide prevention		
153	programs that focus on the needs of children who have been served by the Division of Juvenile		
154	Justice Services.		
155	Section 4. Appropriation.		
156	The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,		
157	2017, and ending June 30, 2018. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for		
158	fiscal year 2018. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures		
159	Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts		
160	indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.
