10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
1	Section 1. Section 53A-15-2001 is enacted to read:
12	Part 20. Kindergarten Supplemental Enrichment Program
-3	<u>53A-15-2001.</u> Title.
4	This part is known as "Kindergarten Supplemental Enrichment Program."
5	Section 2. Section 53A-15-2002 is enacted to read:
6	<u>53A-15-2002.</u> Definitions.
7	As used in this part:
8	(1) "Board" means the State Board of Education.
.9	(2) "Eligible school" means a charter or school district school in which:
0	(a) at least 10% of the students experience intergenerational poverty; or
51	(b) 50% of students were eligible to receive free or reduced lunch in the previous
52	school year.
53	(3) "Intergenerational poverty" means the same as that term is defined in Section
54	35A-9-102.
55	(4) "Kindergarten supplemental enrichment program" means a program to improve the
56	academic competency of kindergarten students that:

57	(a) meets the criteria described in Section 53A-15-2003;
58	(b) receives funding from a grant program described in Section 53A-15-2003; and
59	(c) is administered by an eligible school.
60	Section 3. Section 53A-15-2003 is enacted to read:
61	53A-15-2003. Grant funding for kindergarten supplemental enrichment
62	programs.
63	(1) (a) In accordance with this section, the board shall distribute funds appropriated
64	under this section to support kindergarten supplemental enrichment programs, giving priority
65	first to awarding funds to an eligible school with at least 10% of the students in an eligible
66	school experiencing intergenerational poverty and second priority to an eligible school in
67	which 50% of students were eligible to receive free or reduced lunch in the previous school
68	<u>year.</u>
69	(b) The board may use up to 1% of the funds described in Subsection (1)(a) for the
70	administrative cost of running the grant programs described in Subsection (2).
71	(c) The board shall develop kindergarten entry and exit assessments for use by a
72	kindergarten supplemental enrichment program.
73	(2) (a) The board shall administer a qualifying grant program as described in this
74	Subsection (2) to distribute funds described in Subsection (1)(a) to an eligible school:
75	(i) that applies for a grant;
76	(ii) that offers a kindergarten supplemental enrichment program that meets the
77	requirements described in Subsection (3);
78	(iii) that has an overall need for a kindergarten supplemental enrichment program,
79	based on the results of the eligible school's kindergarten entry and exit assessments described
80	in Subsection (3)(b)(ii);
81	(iv) if the eligible school has previously established a kindergarten supplemental
82	enrichment program under this section, that shows success of the eligible school's kindergarten
83	supplemental enrichment program, based on the results of the eligible school's kindergarten
84	entry and exit assessments described in Subsection (3)(b)(ii); and
85	(v) that proposes a kindergarten supplemental enrichment program that addresses the
86	particular needs of students at risk of experiencing intergenerational poverty.
87	(b) An eligible school shall include in a grant application a letter from the principal of

88	the eligible school certifying that the eligible school's proposed kindergarten supplemental
89	enrichment program will meet the needs of either children in intergenerational poverty or
90	children who are eligible to receive free or reduced lunch as appropriate for the eligible
91	school."
92	(3) An eligible school that receives a grant as described in Subsection (2) shall:
93	(a) use the grant money to offer a kindergarten supplemental enrichment program to:
94	(i) target kindergarten students at risk for not meeting grade 3 core standards for Utah
95	public schools, established by the board under Section 53A-1-402.6, by the end of each
96	student's grade 3 year;
97	(ii) use an evidence-based early intervention model;
98	(iii) focus on academically improving age-appropriate literacy and numeracy skills;
99	(iv) emphasize the use of live instruction;
100	(v) administer the kindergarten entry and exit assessments described in Subsection
101	(1)(c); and
102	(vi) deliver the kindergarten supplemental enrichment program through additional
103	hours or other means; and
104	(b) report to the board annually regarding:
105	(i) how the eligible school used grant money received under Subsection (2);
106	(ii) the results of the eligible school's kindergarten entry and exit assessments for the
107	prior year;
108	(iii) with assistance from board employees, the number of students served, including
109	the number of students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch; and
110	(iv) with assistance from board employees, student performance outcomes achieved by
111	the eligible school's kindergarten supplemental enrichment program, disaggregated by
112	economic and ethnic subgroups.
113	(4) An eligible school that receives a grant as described in Subsection (2) may not
114	receive funds appropriated under Section 53A-17a-167.
115	(5) A parent or legal guardian may decline participation of the parent or legal
116	guardian's kindergarten student in an eligible school's kindergarten supplemental enrichment
117	program.
118	(6) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the

119	board shall make rules to establish reporting procedures and administer this section.
120	Section 4. Appropriation.
121	The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
122	2017, and ending June 30, 2018. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for
123	fiscal year 2018. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures
124	Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts
125	indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.

141	The Legislature intends that the Department of Workforce Services (DWS) authorize
142	Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) for three years for the Kindergarten
143	Supplemental Enrichment Program (\$2,880,000 per year). This TANF funding is dependent
144	upon availability of TANF funding and expenditures meeting the necessary requirements to
145	qualify for the federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program. The Legislature
146	further intends that DWS report to the Office of the Legislative Fiscal Analyst no later than
147	September 1, 2017, regarding the status of these efforts.
