LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill enacts provisions relating to audio recordings created by emergency first responders.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

► provides that a training audio recording made during an emergency event when an emergency responder is resuscitating an individual with a life-threatening condition is not a record subject to government records provisions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **11-55-101** is enacted to read:

CHAPTER 55. LOCAL GOVERNMENT EMERGENCY RESPONDER TRAINING

11-55-101. Title.

This chapter is known as "Local Government Emergency Responder Training."

Section 2. Section **11-55-102** is enacted to read:

11-55-102. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

(1) "Emergency responder" means an employee of a local government entity who is employed to provide law enforcement, fire protection, paramedic, emergency medical, or other first responder service.

(2) "Local government entity" means a county, city, town, local district under Title 17B, Limited Purpose Local Government Entities - Local Districts, special service district under Title 17D, Chapter 1, Special Service District Act, or interlocal entity, as defined in Section [11-13-103](#).

(3) "Record" means the same as that term is defined in Section [63G-2-103](#).

(4) "Training audio recording" means an audio recording that is:

(a) produced by an audio recording device that is integrated into a device or piece of equipment designed or intended for resuscitating an individual with a life-threatening condition;

(b) produced during an emergency event when an emergency responder:

(i) is responding to someone with a life-threatening condition; and

(ii) uses a device or piece of equipment designed or intended for resuscitating an individual with a life-threatening condition; and

(c) intended and used for purposes of training emergency responders how to improve their response to a life-threatening situation.

Section 3. Section **11-55-103** is enacted to read:

11-55-103. Status of training audio recording.

A training audio recording is not a record for purposes of Title 63G, Chapter 2, Government Records Access and Management Act.
