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| 28 | WHEREAS, Utah Code Subsection 62A-5-206.6(5) requires that the Utah State                           |
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| 29 | Developmental Center's Governing Board obtain the approval of the Legislature before offering       |
| 30 | real property or water rights associated with the Utah State Developmental Center (USDC) for        |
| 31 | sale, exchange, or long-term lease;   |
| 32 | WHEREAS, in 1929, the Legislature established the Utah State Training Center to                     |
| 33 | assist with the care, protection, treatment, and education of individuals with mental disabilities; |
| 34 | WHEREAS, the Utah State Training Center, later known as the USDC, was established                   |
| 35 | during an era when relatively little was known about the causes of mental disabilities;             |
| 36 | WHEREAS, like other states, Utah built a public institution in a remote location and                |
| 37 | within a broad perimeter of land that provided a physical barrier between the institution and the   |
| 38 | nearest rural homes and communities;  |
| 39 | WHEREAS, since its establishment in 1929, the USDC has evolved and improved                         |
| 40 | regarding what public services should be provided for individuals with mental disabilities and      |
| 41 | how to provide those services;  |
| 42 | WHEREAS, since state governments first acknowledged a public interest in and                        |
| 43 | accepted some fiscal responsibility for citizens with disabilities, states have made sweeping       |
| 44 | changes in the philosophy and practice of providing public services to those citizens;              |
| 45 | WHEREAS, these paradigm shifts have resulted from a growing knowledge about                         |
| 46 | disabilities, including their causes, preventions, interventions, and accommodations;               |
| 47 | WHEREAS, also contributing to the paradigm shifts was an improving regard for                       |
| 48 | individuals who experience disabilities, as evidenced by public laws that affirm and promote        |
| 49 | their rights, an expansion of publicly funded services, and greater inclusion by their              |
| 50 | communities;  |
| 51 | WHEREAS, in April 1999, Utah's Lieutenant Governor, Olene Walker, issued a set of                   |
| 52 | guiding principles entitled "Principles to Guide the Delivery of Publicly Funded Services for       |
| 53 | People with Disabilities in Utah";  |
| 54 | WHEREAS, these principles were developed by a group of individuals representing the                 |
| 55 | Governor's office, the Legislature, state agencies, service providers, and parent advocates;        |
| 56 | WHEREAS, the principles were distributed in the community and public comment was                    |
| 57 | received at a meeting conducted by the Lieutenant Governor on April 13, 1999;                       |
| 58 | WHEREAS, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Health                              |

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| 59 | subsequently adopted these principles to guide how they provide services;                           |
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| 60 | WHEREAS, like providers of community-based services, the USDC is currently                          |
| 61 | working to support and promote more individual-centered services, a greater choice of services      |
| 62 | and supports, and increased opportunities for inclusion of individuals with mental disabilities     |
| 63 | in the community;   |
| 64 | WHEREAS, today, Utah's citizens across the entire state are served under the direction              |
| 65 | of the Department of Human Services and the Division of Services for People with                    |
| 66 | Disabilities;   |
| 67 | WHEREAS, the USDC provides 24-hour residential care, is Utah's only state-operated                  |
| 68 | intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities, and takes great pride in |
| 69 | serving these most vulnerable of Utah's citizens;   |
| 70 | WHEREAS, as other providers in the state struggle to provide care for individuals with              |
| 71 | complex emotional, medical, and behavioral issues, the USDC is in the unique position of            |
| 72 | providing most of the essential services at a single location;                                      |
| 73 | WHEREAS, the USDC's development of a master plan to guide its service is central to                 |
| 74 | its present and future success in providing services for individuals with mental disabilities;      |
| 75 | WHEREAS, the master plan was developed in conjunction with an overall strategic                     |
| 76 | vision for the future use of the USDC;  |
| 77 | WHEREAS, the strategic planning group included a wide range of stakeholders and the                 |
| 78 | master plan was vetted by conducting over 30 public meetings and planning sessions;                 |
| 79 | WHEREAS, input for the planning process was received from:  |
| 80 | <ul> <li>individuals living at the USDC and their families;</li> </ul>                              |
| 81 | <ul> <li>neighborhoods, counties, and cities surrounding the USDC;</li> </ul>                       |
| 82 | <ul> <li>community advocacy groups representing individuals with disabilities; and</li> </ul>       |
| 83 | <ul> <li>community service providers that regularly work with the USDC;</li> </ul>                  |
| 84 | WHEREAS, the USDC master plan creates a long-term vision for undeveloped                            |

WHEREAS, the USDC master plan creates a long-term vision for undeveloped property that is in accordance with the original purpose of the Legislature in creating this resource for Utahns with disabilities;

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88 89 WHEREAS, the master plan provides a long-term revenue source for individuals with disabilities living in Utah, while preserving the original purpose of the land and maximizing development potential;

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| 90   | WHEREAS, the master plan was created with a sustainable methodology, including a  |
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| 91   | balance between environmental sensitivity, community connections, artistic beauty, and  |
| 92   | economic viability;   |
| 93   | WHEREAS, the USDC's mission is "dedication to providing an array of resources and   |
| 94   | supports for individuals with disabilities with complex or acute needs in Utah";  |
| 95   | WHEREAS, the USDC's vision is to "provide an effective, efficient array of critical   |
| 96   | services and supports that promote independence and quality of life for Utah's most vulnerable  |
| 97   | individuals with disabilities in partnership with families, guardians and the community";   |
| 98   | WHEREAS, by following the master plan, the USDC is in a position to better assist   |
| 99   | individuals with disabilities to achieve their highest potential in an atmosphere that preserves  |
| 100  | personal dignity; and   |
| 101  | WHEREAS, the USDC is ready to begin incrementally developing a portion of the   |
| 102  | USDC campus in accordance with the master plan:   |
| 103  | NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah  |
| 104  | expresses support for the incremental implementation of the USDC's master plan.   |
| 105  | BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in accordance with Utah Code Subsection  |
| 106  | 62A-5-206.6(5), the Legislature authorizes the Utah State Developmental Center's Governing  |
| 107  | Board $\hat{S} \rightarrow [to \ enter \ into]$ to approve $\leftarrow \hat{S}$ a long-term lease for approximately 7.7 acres of land and |
| 107a | water rights  |
