8	General Description:
9	This bill amends notification provisions in the Election Code.
10	Highlighted Provisions:
11	This bill:
12	requires that a notice of bond election include the address of a website that lists the
13	location of each polling place;
14	 permits an election officer to change or add polling locations after the time of the
15	initial notification of polling places;
16	 provides for public notice of an additional polling place or a change in the location
17	of a polling place;
18	 amends election notification and voter information pamphlet provisions to provide
19	for notice of polling places that are changed or added under the provisions of this
20	bill;
21	requires publication of a phone number that a voter may call to obtain information
22	regarding the location of a polling place; and
23	makes technical and conforming amendments.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 11-14-202 is amended to read:
11-14-202. Notice of election Contents Publication Mailing.
(1) The governing body shall ensure that notice of the election is provided:
(a) once per week during three consecutive weeks by publication in a newspaper
having general circulation in the local political subdivision in accordance with Section
11-14-316, the first publication occurring not less than 21 nor more than 35 days before the
election;
(b) on a website, if available, in accordance with Section 45-1-101 for the three weeks
that immediately precede the election; and
(c) in a local political subdivision where there is no newspaper of general circulation,
by posting notice of the bond election in at least five public places in the local political
subdivision at least 21 days before the election.
(2) When the debt service on the bonds to be issued will increase the property tax
imposed upon the average value of a residence by an amount that is greater than or equal to \$15
per year, the governing body shall prepare and mail either a voter information pamphlet or a
notification described in Subsection (6):
(a) at least 15 days but not more than 45 days before the bond election;
(b) to each household containing a registered voter who is eligible to vote on the
bonds; and

5/	(c) that includes the information required by Subsections (3) and (4).
58	(3) The notice and voter information pamphlet required by this section shall include:
59	(a) the date [and place] of the election;
60	(b) the hours during which the polls will be open; and
61	(c) the title and text of the ballot proposition.
62	(4) The voter information pamphlet required by this section shall include:
63	(a) the information required by Subsection (3); [and]
64	(b) the address of a website that lists the location of each polling place for the bond
65	election, including the location of the polling place for each voting precinct, each early voting
66	location, and each election day voting center;

79	explain the property tax impact of issuance of the bonds.
80	(5) The election officer may change the location of, or designate additional polling
81	places for, a voting precinct, early voting, or an election day voting center at any time by
82	updating the information on the website described in Subsection (4)(b).
83	[(5)] (6) The governing body shall pay the costs associated with the notice required by
84	this section.
85	[(6)] (7) (a) The governing body may mail a notice printed on a postage prepaid,
86	preaddressed return form that a person may use to request delivery of a voter information
87	pamphlet by mail.

88	(b) The notice described in Subsection [(6)] <u>(7)</u> (a) shall include:
89	(i) the website upon which the voter information pamphlet is available; and
90	(ii) the phone number a voter may call to request delivery of a voter information
91	pamphlet by mail.

94	Section 2. Section 20A-3-603 is amended to read:
95	20A-3-603. Early voting polling places.
96	(1) Except as provided in Section 20A-1-308, the election officer shall designate one or
97	more polling places for early voting, provided that:
98	(a) at least one polling place is open on each day that polls are open during the early
99	voting period;
100	(b) each polling place meets the requirements for polling places under Chapter 5,
101	Election Administration;
102	(c) for all elections other than local special elections, municipal primary elections, and
103	municipal general elections, at least 10% of the voting devices at a polling place are accessible
104	for individuals with disabilities in accordance with Public Law 107-252, the Help America
105	Vote Act of 2002; and
106	(d) each polling place is located in a government building or office, unless the election
107	officer determines that, in the area designated by the election officer, there is no government
108	building or office available that:
109	(i) can be scheduled for use during early voting hours;
110	(ii) has the physical facilities necessary to accommodate early voting requirements;
111	(iii) has adequate space for voting equipment, poll workers, and voters; and
112	(iv) has adequate security, public accessibility, and parking.

134	calendar days before the date that early voting begins; and
135	[(b)] (ii) in accordance with Section 45-1-101, at least five calendar days before the

150	(1) The election officer may designate one or more polling places as an election day
151	voting center if:
152	[(1)] (a) the election officer notifies the lieutenant governor of the designation and
153	location of an election day voting center at least 15 days before the election;
154	[(2)] (b) a polling place meets the requirements for a polling place under Chapter 5,
155	Election Administration; and
156	[(3)] (c) a polling place is located in a government building or office, unless the
157	election officer determines that there is no government building or office available, in the area
158	designated by the election officer, that:
159	[(a)] (i) can be scheduled for use during election day voting hours;

169	(1) On or before November 15 in the year before each regular general election year, the
170	lieutenant governor shall prepare and transmit a written notice to each county clerk that:
171	(a) designates the offices to be filled at the next year's regular general election;
172	(b) identifies the dates for filing a declaration of candidacy, and for submitting and
173	certifying nomination petition signatures, as applicable, under Sections 20A-9-403, 20A-9-407
174	and 20A-9-408 for those offices;
175	(c) includes the master ballot position list for the next year and the year following as
176	established under Section 20A-6-305; and
177	(d) contains a description of any ballot propositions to be decided by the voters that
178	have qualified for the ballot as of that date.

215	(1) The lieutenant governor shall ensure that all information submitted for publication
216	in the voter information pamphlet is:
217	(a) printed and bound in a single pamphlet;
218	(b) printed in clear readable type, no less than 10 point, except that the text of any
219	measure may be set forth in eight-point type; and
220	(c) printed on a quality and weight of paper that best serves the voters.
221	(2) The voter information pamphlet shall contain the following items in this order:
222	(a) a cover title page;
223	(b) an introduction to the pamphlet by the lieutenant governor;
224	(c) a table of contents;
225	(d) a list of all candidates for constitutional offices;
226	(e) a list of candidates for each legislative district;
227	(f) a 100-word statement of qualifications for each candidate for the office of governor
228	lieutenant governor, attorney general, state auditor, or state treasurer, if submitted by the
229	candidate to the lieutenant governor's office before 5 p.m. on the date that falls 105 days before
230	the date of the election;
231	(g) information pertaining to all measures to be submitted to the voters, beginning a
232	new page for each measure and containing, in the following order for each measure:
233	(i) a copy of the number and ballot title of the measure;
234	(ii) the final vote cast by the Legislature on the measure if it is a measure submitted by
235	the Legislature or by referendum;
236	(iii) the impartial analysis of the measure prepared by the Office of Legislative
237	Research and General Counsel;
238	(iv) the arguments in favor of the measure, the rebuttal to the arguments in favor of the
239	measure, the arguments against the measure, and the rebuttal to the arguments against the
240	measure, with the name and title of the authors at the end of each argument or rebuttal;
241	(v) for each constitutional amendment, a complete copy of the text of the constitutional
242	amendment, with all new language underlined, and all deleted language placed within brackets

243	(vi) for each initiative qualified for the ballot, a copy of the measure as certified by the
244	lieutenant governor and a copy of the fiscal impact estimate prepared according to Section
245	20A-7-202.5; and
246	(vii) for each referendum qualified for the ballot, a complete copy of the text of the law
247	being submitted to the voters for their approval or rejection, with all new language underlined
248	and all deleted language placed within brackets, as applicable;
249	(h) a description provided by the Judicial Performance Evaluation Commission of the
250	selection and retention process for judges, including, in the following order:
251	(i) a description of the judicial selection process;
252	(ii) a description of the judicial performance evaluation process;
253	(iii) a description of the judicial retention election process;
254	(iv) a list of the criteria of the judicial performance evaluation and the minimum
255	performance standards;
256	(v) the names of the judges standing for retention election; and
257	(vi) for each judge:
258	(A) a list of the counties in which the judge is subject to retention election;
259	(B) a short biography of professional qualifications and a recent photograph;
