

NAIL SALON AMENDMENTS

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends provisions related to nail salons.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ requires a nail salon that files or shapes an acrylic nail to be equipped with a source capture system under certain circumstances; and
- ▶ requires a nail salon to provide inlets for a source capture system near the point of chemical application under certain circumstances.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **15A-3-401** is amended to read:



28 **15A-3-401. General provisions.**

29 (1) The ~~following~~ amendments in this part are adopted as amendments to the IMC to
30 be applicable statewide[?].

31 ~~(1)~~ (2) In IMC, Section 1004.2, the first sentence is deleted and replaced with the
32 following: " In accordance with Title 34A, Chapter 7, Safety, and requirements made by rule by
33 the Labor Commission, boilers and pressure vessels in Utah are regulated by the Utah Labor
34 Commission, Division of Boiler, Elevator and Coal Mine Safety, except those located in
35 private residences or in apartment houses of less than five family units. Boilers shall be
36 installed in accordance with their listing and labeling, with minimum clearances as prescribed
37 by the manufacturer's installation instructions and the state boiler code, whichever is greater."

38 ~~(2)~~ (3) In IMC, Section 1004.3.1, the word "unlisted" is inserted before the word
39 "boilers".

40 ~~(3)~~ (4) IMC, Section 1101.10, is deleted.

41 ~~(4)~~ (5) In IMC, Section 1209.3, the following words are added at the end of the
42 section: "or other methods approved for the application."

43 Section 2. Section **15A-3-402** is enacted to read:

44 **15A-3-402. Amendments to Chapters 1 through 5 of the International Mechanical**
45 **Code.**

46 (1) In IMC, Table 403.3, note h is deleted and replaced with the following:

47 "h. 1. A nail salon shall provide each manicure station where a nail technician files or
48 shapes an acrylic nail, as defined by rule by the Division of Occupational and Professional
49 Licensing, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act,
50 with:

51 a. a source capture system capable of filtering and recirculating air to inside space at a
52 rate not less than 50 cfm per station; or

53 b. a source capture system capable of exhausting not less than 50 cfm per station.

54 2. For a source capture system described in paragraph 1, the source capture system
55 inlets for exhausting or recirculating air shall be located in accordance with Section 502.20.

56 3. Where one or more exhausting source capture systems described in paragraph 1
57 operate continuously during occupancy, the source capture system exhaust rate shall be
58 permitted to be applied to the exhaust flow rate required by Table 403.3.1.1 for the nail salon.

- 59 4. The requirements of this note apply to:
60 a. an existing nail salon that remodels the nail salon after July 1, 2017;
61 b. a new nail salon that begins construction after July 1, 2017; and
62 c. all nail salons beginning on July 1, 2020."
63 (2) In IMC, Section 502.20 is deleted and rewritten as follows:
64 "502.20 Manicure stations. A nail salon shall provide each manicure station with a
65 source capture system in accordance with Table 403.3.1.1, note h. For a manicure table that
66 does not have factory-installed source capture system inlets for recirculating or exhausting air,
67 a nail salon shall provide the manicure table with inlets for recirculating or exhausting air
68 located not more than 12 inches (305 mm) horizontally and vertically from the point of
69 chemical application.
70 Exception: Section 502.20 applies to a manicure station in:
71 a. an existing nail salon that remodels the nail salon after July 1, 2017;
72 b. a new nail salon that begins construction after July 1, 2017; and
73 c. all nail salons beginning on July 1, 2020."
