36	Section 1. Section <b>53A-1a-501.4</b> is enacted to read:
37	53A-1a-501.4. Charter school authorizer standards State Board of Education
38	rules for review of authorizer action.
39	(1) The State Board of Education shall adopt principles and standards for quality
40	charter authorizing, including:
41	(a) principles that:
42	(i) maintain high education standards;
43	(ii) subject to law, uphold charter school autonomy; and
44	(iii) protect student and public interests; and
45	(b) standards that ensure:
46	(i) authorizer commitment and capacity;
47	(ii) a fair and reasonable application process and determination;
48	(iii) performance contracting:
49	(iv) ongoing oversight and evaluation; and
50	(v) fair and reasonable consequences for an authorizer that fails to comply with a
51	statute, rule, or, as described in this Subsection (1), principles and standards.
52	(2) A charter school authorizer shall adopt and administer policies and practices
53	consistent with the principles and standards described in Subsection (1).
54	(3) The State Board of Education shall, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah
55	Administrative Rulemaking Act, make rules for the oversight of an authorizer, including:
56	(a) overseeing authorizer compliance with statute, as applicable, and the principals and
57	standards described in Subsection (1) and the applicable policies and practices described in
58	Subsection (2);

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59	(b) rules that authorize assistance by the State Board of Education, if necessary, to an
60	authorizer in an effort to comply; and
61	(c) penalties for an authorizer that fails, after reasonable notice, to comply, including a
62	moratorium on the authorizer's authority to authorize a new charter school or enter into a
63	contract.
64	Section 2. Section <b>53A-1a-501.7</b> is amended to read:
65	53A-1a-501.7. State Charter School Board Staff director Staff.
66	(1) [(a)] The State Charter School Board[, with the consent of the superintendent of
67	public instruction,] shall appoint a staff director for the State Charter School Board.
68	[(b)] (2) The State Charter School Board shall have authority to remove the staff
69	director [with the consent of the superintendent of public instruction].
70	[(c)] (3) The position of staff director is exempt from the career service provisions of
71	Title 67, Chapter 19, Utah State Personnel Management Act.
72	(4) The State Charter school board may employ other staff as necessary.
73	[(2)] (5) The superintendent of public instruction shall provide space for staff of the
74	State Charter School Board in facilities occupied by the State Board of Education or the State
75	Board of Education's employees[, with costs charged for the facilities equal to those charged
76	other sections and divisions under the State Board of Education].

78	53A-1a-505. Charter schools authorized by the State Charter School Board
79	Application process Prohibited bases of application denial.
80	(1) (a) An applicant seeking authorization of a charter school from the State Charter
81	School Board shall provide a copy of the application to the local school board of the school
82	district in which the proposed charter school shall be located either before or at the same time it
83	files its application with the State Charter School Board.
84	(b) The local board may review the application and may offer suggestions or
85	recommendations to the applicant or the State Charter School Board prior to its acting on the
86	application.
87	(c) The State Charter School Board shall give due consideration to suggestions or
88	recommendations made by the local school board under Subsection (1)(b).
89	(d) The State Charter School Board shall review and, by majority vote, either approve

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90	or deny the application.
91	(e) The State Board of Education shall, by majority vote, within 60 days after action by
92	the State Charter School Board under Subsection (1)(d):
93	[(i) approve or deny an application approved by the State Charter School Board; or]
94	[(ii) hear an appeal, if any, of an application denied by the State Charter School Board.]
95	(i) certify that the action of the State Charter School Board complies with the rules
96	adopted under Section 53A-1a-501.4; or
97	(ii) remand the decision to the State Charter School Board with written notice of
98	noncompliance.
99	(f) The State Board of Education's action under Subsection (1)(d) is final action subject
100	to judicial review.
101	(g) A charter school application may not be denied on the basis that the establishment
102	of the charter school will have any or all of the following impacts on a public school, including
103	another charter school:
104	(i) an enrollment decline;
105	(ii) a decrease in funding; or
106	(iii) a modification of programs or services.
107	(2) The State Board of Education shall make a rule providing a timeline for the
108	opening of a charter school following the approval of a charter school application by the State
109	Charter School Board.
110	(3) After approval of a charter school application and in accordance with Section
111	53A-1a-508, the applicant and the State Charter School Board shall set forth the terms and
112	conditions for the operation of the charter school in a written charter agreement.
113	(4) The State Charter School Board shall, in accordance with State Board of Education
114	rules, establish and make public the State Charter School Board's:
115	(a) application requirements, in accordance with Section 53A-1a-504;
116	(b) application process, including timelines, in accordance with this section; and
117	(c) minimum academic, financial, and enrollment standards.

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121	(1) As used in this section:
122	(a) "Charter school officer" means:
123	(i) a member of a charter school's governing board;
124	(ii) a member of a board or an officer of a nonprofit corporation under which a charter
125	school is organized and managed; or
126	(iii) the chief administrative officer of a charter school.
127	(b) (i) "Employment" means a position in which a person's salary, wages, pay, or
128	compensation, whether as an employee or contractor, is paid from charter school funds.
129	(ii) "Employment" does not include a charter school volunteer.
130	(c) "Relative" means a father, mother, husband, wife, son, daughter, sister, brother,
131	uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, first cousin, mother-in-law, father-in-law, brother-in-law,
132	sister-in-law, son-in-law, or daughter-in-law.
133	(2) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2)(b), a relative of a charter school officer
134	may not be employed at a charter school.
135	(b) If a relative of a charter school officer is to be considered for employment in a
136	charter school, the charter school officer shall:
137	(i) disclose the relationship, in writing, to the other charter school officers;
138	(ii) submit the employment decision to the charter school's governing board for the
139	approval, by majority vote, of the charter school's governing board;
140	(iii) abstain from voting on the issue; and
141	(iv) be absent from [any] the portion of the meeting [when] where the employment is
142	being considered and determined.
143	(3) (a) Except as provided in Subsections (3)(b) and (3)(c), a charter school officer or a
144	relative of a charter school officer may not have a financial interest in a contract or other
145	transaction involving a charter school in which the charter school officer serves as a charter
146	school officer.
147	(b) If a charter school's governing board considers entering into a contract or executing
148	a transaction in which a charter school officer or a relative of a charter school officer has a
149	financial interest, the charter school officer shall:
150	(i) disclose the financial interest, in writing, to the other charter school officers;
151	(ii) submit the contract or transaction decision to the charter school's governing board

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152	for the approval, by majority vote, of the charter school's governing board;
153	(iii) abstain from voting on the issue; and
154	(iv) be absent from [any] the portion of the meeting [when] where the contract or
155	transaction is being considered and determined.
156	(c) The provisions in Subsection (3)(a) do not apply to a reasonable contract of
157	employment for:
158	(i) the chief administrative officer of a charter school; or
159	(ii) a relative of the chief administrative officer of a charter school whose employment
160	is approved in accordance with the provisions in Subsection (2).
161	(4) The State Board of Education or State Charter School Board may not operate a
162	charter school.

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
