	[(1) When a vacancy occurs for any reason in the office of a representative in
Con	ngress, the governor shall issue a proclamation calling an election to fill the vacancy.]
	$[\frac{(2)(a)}{2}]$ When a vacancy occurs in the office of $[\frac{U.S.}{2}]$ United States senator, $[it]$
the	vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next regular general election.
	[(b)] (2) The governor shall appoint [a person] an individual to serve as [U.S.] United

	(1) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2), when a vacancy occurs in the office of
<u>Un</u>	ited States representative, the governor shall, within seven days after the day on which the
vac	eancy occurs:
	(i) issue a proclamation calling a special election to fill the vacancy; and
	(ii) post the proclamation on the lieutenant governor's website.
	(b) An individual who fills a vacancy under this section shall serve until the end of the
terr	m for which the vacancy exists.
	(2) If the vacancy occurs on or after the date of the regular general election, and before
<u>Jan</u>	nuary 1 of the year after the general election:
	(a) the governor may not call a special election to fill the vacancy; and
	(b) the office shall remain vacant for the remainder of the term.
	(3) If the vacancy occurs 127 or fewer days before the day of the next regular general
elec	ction:
	(a) the governor shall, in the proclamation described in Subsection (1)(a), set the date
of t	the election on the same date as the regular general election; and

62	(4) If the vacancy occurs after the day of the regular primary election and more than
63	127 days before the next regular general election:

82	candidacy to run to fill the vacancy:
83	(A) the special election to fill the vacancy shall be held on the date described in
84	Subsection (4)(a)(ii); and
85	(B) the election shall be conducted in accordance with Subsection (5).
86	(5) If the vacancy occurs on or before the date of the regular primary election, and after
87	the beginning of a term for the office of United States representative, the governor shall, in the
88	proclamation described in Subsection (1)(a):
89	(a) set a special election date to fill the vacancy no sooner than 127 days after the date

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90	of the vacancy and no later than 130 days after the date of the vacancy,
91	(b) permit an individual to qualify for placement on the special election ballot in the
92	same manner as an individual is permitted to qualify for placement on a primary election ballot,
93	except that:
94	(i) a primary election will not be held to fill the vacancy; and
95	(ii) the special election shall be the final election to fill the vacancy;
96	(c) establish the deadlines, time frames, and procedures for filing a declaration of
97	candidacy, filing a notice of intent to gather signatures, gathering and submitting signatures,
98	reporting campaign contributions and expenditures, giving notice of an election, and other
99	election requirements;
100	(d) permit an individual no less than 21 days to gather signatures after the first day on
101	which the individual may file a notice of intent to gather signatures;
102	(e) permit a registered political party no less than 30 days before the registered political
103	party is required to certify the name of a candidate for the registered political party;
104	(f) permit a write-in candidate to file a declaration of candidacy as a write-in candidate
105	no later than the deadline described in Subsection (5)(d);
106	(g) provide at least 14 days for an election officer to certify signatures; and
107	(h) require an election officer to send ballots to military and overseas voters no later
108	than 45 days before the date of the election.

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
