NOTICE OF BILL RETURNED TO RULES COMMITTEE

March 6, 2017

Mr. President,

The Judiciary, Law Enforcement, and Criminal Justice Committee has returned **H.B. 93**, JUDICIAL NOMINATING PROCESS AMENDMENTS, by Representative M. F. Nelson to the Rules Committee without recommendation and with the following amendments:

1. Page 2, Lines 51 through 54:

House Floor Amendments

2-15-2017

- 51 (2) (a) In determining which of the applicants are the most qualified, the nominating
- 52 commissions shall determine by a majority vote of the commissioners present which of the
- 53 applicants best possess the Ĥ→ [ability, temperament, training, and experience] legal knowledge
- 53a and ability, judicial temperament, training, professional experience, integrity, impartiality,
- 53b work ethic, financial responsibility, public service, and ability to perform the work of a
- 53c <u>judge</u>, \leftarrow \hat{H} that qualifies them
- 54 for the office.

<u>(b) For diversity on the bench, when deciding among applicants whose</u> <u>qualifications appear in all other respects to be equal, it is relevant to consider the</u> <u>background and experience of the applicants in relation to the current composition</u>
