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7                   **LONG TITLE**

8                   **General Description:**

9                   This bill makes amendments to the Alcohol Abuse Tracking Committee.

10                   **Highlighted Provisions:**

11                   This bill:

- 12                   ▶ moves the Alcohol Abuse Tracking Committee from the Department of Public
- 13                   Safety to the Department of Human Services;
- 14                   ▶ removes the dates by which the committee must annually meet and issue the annual
- 15                   report; and
- 16                   ▶ makes technical changes.

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26                   *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

27                   Section 1. Section **62A-1-121**, which is renumbered from Section 53-1-119 is  
28                   renumbered and amended to read:

29                   ~~[53-1-119]~~.   **62A-1-121**. Tracking effects of abuse of alcoholic products.

30 (1) There is created a committee within the department known as the "Alcohol Abuse  
31 Tracking Committee" that consists of:

32 (a) ~~[the commissioner, or the commissioner's]~~ the executive director or the executive  
33 director's designee;

34 (b) the executive director of the Department of Health~~[-or the]~~ or that executive  
35 director's designee;

36 (c) the ~~[executive director]~~ commissioner of the Department of ~~[Human Services, or~~  
37 ~~the executive director's]~~ Public Safety or the commissioner's designee;

38 (d) the director of the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control~~[-or the]~~ or that  
39 director's designee;

40 (e) the executive director of the Department of Workforce Services~~[-or the]~~ or that  
41 executive director's designee;

42 (f) the chair of the Utah Substance Use and Mental Health Advisory Council~~[-]~~ or the  
43 chair's designee;

44 (g) the state court administrator or the state court administrator's designee; and

45 (h) the executive director of the Department of Technology Services~~[-or the]~~ or that  
46 executive director's designee.

47 (2) ~~[The commissioner, or the commissioner's designee,]~~ The executive director or the  
48 executive director's designee shall chair the committee.

49 (3) (a) Four members of the committee constitute a quorum.

50 (b) A vote of the majority of the committee members present when a quorum is present  
51 is an action of the committee.

52 (4) The committee shall meet at the call of the chair, except that the chair shall call a  
53 meeting at least twice a year:

54 (a) with one meeting held ~~[before April 1 of]~~ each year to develop the report required  
55 under Subsection (7); and

56 (b) with one meeting held to review and finalize the report before ~~[it]~~ the report is  
57 issued ~~[July 1]~~.

- 58 (5) The committee may adopt additional procedures or requirements for:  
59 (a) voting, when there is a tie of the committee members;  
60 (b) how meetings are to be called; and  
61 (c) the frequency of meetings.
- 62 (6) The committee shall establish a process to collect for each calendar year the  
63 following information:
- 64 (a) the number of individuals statewide who are convicted of, plead guilty to, plead no  
65 contest to, plead guilty in a similar manner to, or resolve by diversion or its equivalent to a  
66 violation related to underage drinking of alcohol;
- 67 (b) the number of individuals statewide who are convicted of, plead guilty to, plead no  
68 contest to, plead guilty in a similar manner to, or resolve by diversion or its equivalent to a  
69 violation related to driving under the influence of alcohol;
- 70 (c) the number of violations statewide of Title 32B, Alcoholic Beverage Control Act,  
71 related to over-serving or over-consumption of an alcoholic product;
- 72 (d) the cost of social services provided by the state related to abuse of alcohol,  
73 including services provided by the Division of Child and Family Services [~~within the~~  
74 ~~Department of Human Services~~];
- 75 (e) the location where the alcoholic products [~~are obtained that results~~] that result in the  
76 violations or costs described in Subsections (6)(a) through (d) are obtained; and
- 77 (f) any information the committee determines can be collected and relates to the abuse  
78 of alcoholic products.
- 79 (7) [~~Beginning July 1, 2014, the~~] The committee shall report the information collected  
80 under Subsection (6) annually to the governor and the Legislature by no later than the July 1  
81 immediately following the calendar year for which the information is collected.
