8   **Committee Note:**

9                   The Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Interim Committee recommended this bill.

10 **General Description:**

11                   This bill makes amendments to the Alcohol Abuse Tracking Committee.

12 **Highlighted Provisions:**

13                   This bill:

14                   ▶ moves the Alcohol Abuse Tracking Committee from the Department of Public  
15 Safety to the Department of Human Services;

16                   ▶ removes the dates by which the committee must annually meet and issue the annual  
17 report; and

18                   ▶ makes technical changes.

28 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

29 Section 1. Section **62A-1-121**, which is renumbered from Section 53-1-119 is  
30 renumbered and amended to read:

31 ~~[53-1-119].~~ **62A-1-121. Tracking effects of abuse of alcoholic products.**

32 (1) There is created a committee within the department known as the "Alcohol Abuse  
33 Tracking Committee" that consists of:

34 (a) ~~[the commissioner, or the commissioner's]~~ the executive director or the executive  
35 director's designee;

36 (b) the executive director of the Department of Health~~[, or the]~~ or that executive  
37 director's designee;

38 (c) the ~~[executive director]~~ commissioner of the Department of ~~[Human Services, or~~  
39 ~~the executive director's]~~ Public Safety or the commissioner's designee;

40 (d) the director of the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control~~[, or the]~~ or that  
41 director's designee;

42 (e) the executive director of the Department of Workforce Services~~[, or the]~~ or that  
43 executive director's designee;

44 (f) the chair of the Utah Substance Use and Mental Health Advisory Council~~[;]~~ or the  
45 chair's designee;

46 (g) the state court administrator or the state court administrator's designee; and

47 (h) the executive director of the Department of Technology Services~~[, or the]~~ or that  
48 executive director's designee.

49 (2) ~~[The commissioner, or the commissioner's designee,]~~ The executive director or the  
50 executive director's designee shall chair the committee.

51 (3) (a) Four members of the committee constitute a quorum.

52 (b) A vote of the majority of the committee members present when a quorum is present  
53 is an action of the committee.

54 (4) The committee shall meet at the call of the chair, except that the chair shall call a  
55 meeting at least twice a year:

56 (a) with one meeting held ~~[before April 1 of]~~ each year to develop the report required  
57 under Subsection (7); and

58 (b) with one meeting held to review and finalize the report before ~~[it]~~ the report is

59 issued [~~July 1~~].

60 (5) The committee may adopt additional procedures or requirements for:

61 (a) voting, when there is a tie of the committee members;

62 (b) how meetings are to be called; and

63 (c) the frequency of meetings.

64 (6) The committee shall establish a process to collect for each calendar year the  
65 following information:

66 (a) the number of individuals statewide who are convicted of, plead guilty to, plead no  
67 contest to, plead guilty in a similar manner to, or resolve by diversion or its equivalent to a  
68 violation related to underage drinking of alcohol;

69 (b) the number of individuals statewide who are convicted of, plead guilty to, plead no  
70 contest to, plead guilty in a similar manner to, or resolve by diversion or its equivalent to a  
71 violation related to driving under the influence of alcohol;

72 (c) the number of violations statewide of Title 32B, Alcoholic Beverage Control Act,  
73 related to over-serving or over-consumption of an alcoholic product;

74 (d) the cost of social services provided by the state related to abuse of alcohol,  
75 including services provided by the Division of Child and Family Services [~~within the~~  
76 ~~Department of Human Services~~];

77 (e) the location where the alcoholic products [~~are obtained that results~~] that result in the  
78 violations or costs described in Subsections (6)(a) through (d) are obtained; and

79 (f) any information the committee determines can be collected and relates to the abuse  
80 of alcoholic products.

81 (7) [~~Beginning July 1, 2014, the~~] The committee shall report the information collected  
82 under Subsection (6) annually to the governor and the Legislature by no later than the July 1  
83 immediately following the calendar year for which the information is collected.
