	[In addition to the definitions in Section 58-1-102, as] As used in this chapter:



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40	(1) Board means the Physician Assistant Licensing Board created in Section
29	58-70a-201.
30	(2) (a) "Delegation of services agreement" means written criteria jointly developed by a
31	physician assistant and the physician assistant's supervising physician and, if applicable, the
32	physician assistant's substitute supervising physicians [and the physician assistant], that permits
33	a physician assistant, working under the direction or review of the supervising physician, to
34	assist in the management of common illnesses and injuries.
