LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill deals with an area along the Jordan River.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- defines terms; and
- authorizes the Division of <u>{Parks}Forestry, Fire</u>, and <u>{Recreation}State Lands</u>, in consultation with the Jordan River Commission and <u>{the relevant land owning jurisdiction}other entities</u>, to expend money as appropriations allow on projects around the Jordan River <u>under certain conditions</u>.

Money Appropriated in this Bill:

This bill appropriates in fiscal year 2019:

- to the Department of Natural Resources -- Division of {Parks}<u>Forestry</u>, Fire, and {Recreation}<u>State Lands</u> -- Operation and Management:
 - from the General Fund, one-time, \$500,000; and
- to the Department of Natural Resources -- Division of {Parks}<u>Forestry</u>, Fire, and {Recreation}<u>State Lands</u> -- Operation and Management:
 - from the General Fund, ongoing, \$500,000.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **79-4-801.5** is enacted to read:

79-4-801.5. Definitions.

As used in this part:

(1) "Commission" means the Jordan River Commission created by interlocal

agreement.

(2) "Zone" means the Jordan River Recreation Area, the area 250 yards on each side of the Jordan River from the edge of the river between SR-201 and 4430 South, excluding property located in the city of Murray.

Section 2. Section **79-4-803** is enacted to read:

79-4-803. Jordan River improvement projects.

(1) The division, {in consultation with the commission, with the approval of an individual land-owning jurisdiction, and subject to Subsection (2), may}subject to applicable federal, state, and local laws and ordinances and Subsections (2) and (3), may:

(a) expend money for the following purposes:

(fari) enhancing safety, recreation, and conservation in the zone;

({b}ii) capital improvements within the zone, including:

({i}A) lighting along the Jordan River and within the zone;

(<u>{ii}B</u>) completing construction of a paved pathway on both sides of the Jordan River within the zone;

(<u>{iii}C</u>) building a boat launch, picnic pavilion, bench, restroom, or other amenity within the zone; and

(<u>{iv}D</u>) supporting an aviary, nature area, bike or boat rental concessionaire, or other partnerships to enhance recreation in the zone;

({e}iii) funding programs to clean the zone, remove invasive species, and restore riparian habitat;

(<u>{d}iv</u>) hiring or contracting for personnel to perform tasks as directed by the commission;

(v) partnering or contracting with urban ranger or similar service-oriented organizations or programs:

(A) to provide trail maintenance, emergency care, and environmental education; and

({e}<u>B</u>) to report to the appropriate public official all health, safety, or law enforcement concerns that the organization encounters in the zone, as directed by the commission; and

(vi) partnering or contracting with local law enforcement, a certified peace officer, or an urban ranger program to provide patrol, security, and law enforcement for the area 250 yards on each side of the Jordan River from the edge of the river between the Great Salt Lake and Utah Lake; and

(b) purchase, lease, sell, or dispose of property or an easement within the zone to achieve the goals in Subsection (1)(a).

(2) Before engaging in any activity described in Subsection (1), the division shall:

(a) consult with the commission; and

(b) receive the approval of:

(i) Salt Lake County flood control;

(ii) any relevant governmental entity that owns or is responsible for the maintenance of real property within the zone; and

(iii) the relevant municipality within the zone.

(3) The programs described in this section may only be implemented as appropriations from the Legislature allow.

Section 3. Appropriation.

The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for fiscal year 2019. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.

The Legislature intends that the Division of {Parks and Recreation use}Forestry, Fire, and State Lands use up to 10% of appropriated funds on administrative functions and then spend remaining funds appropriated under this section to implement the programs described in Section 79-4-803, with half the <u>remaining</u> money appropriated expended on the programs described in Subsections 79-4-803(1)(a) through (d) and half of the <u>remaining</u> money appropriated expended on the programs described in {Subsection}Subsections 79-4-803(1)(e){;
