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24 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

25 Section 1. Section **63M-7-202** is amended to read:

26 **63M-7-202. Composition -- Appointments -- Ex officio members -- Terms --**

27 **United States Attorney as nonvoting member.**



28 (1) The commission on criminal and juvenile justice shall be composed of ~~[21]~~ 24  
29 voting members as follows:

30 (a) the chief justice of the supreme court, as the presiding officer of the judicial  
31 council, or a judge designated by the chief justice;

32 (b) the state court administrator or the state court administrator's designee;

33 (c) the executive director of the Department of Corrections or the executive director's  
34 designee;

35 (d) the director of the Division of Juvenile Justice Services or the director's designee;

36 (e) the commissioner of the Department of Public Safety or the commissioner's  
37 designee;

38 (f) the attorney general or the attorney general's designee;

39 (g) the president of the chiefs of police association or a chief of police designated by  
40 the association's president;

41 (h) the president of the sheriffs' association or a sheriff designated by the association's  
42 president;

43 (i) the chair of the Board of Pardons and Parole or a member designated by the chair;

44 (j) the chair of the Utah Sentencing Commission or a member designated by the chair;

45 (k) the chair of the Utah Substance Use and Mental Health Advisory Council or a  
46 member designated by the chair;

47 (l) the chair of the Utah Board of Juvenile Justice or a member designated by the chair;

48 (m) the chair of the Utah Council on Victims of Crime ~~[or the chair's designee]~~ or a  
49 member designated by the chair;

50 (n) the director of the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health or the director's  
51 designee; ~~[and]~~

52 (o) the executive director of the Salt Lake Legal Defender Association or the executive  
53 director's designee;

54 (p) the chair of the Utah Indigent Defense Commission or the chair's designee;

55 (q) the Salt Lake County District Attorney or another attorney designated by the district  
56 attorney; and

57 ~~[(r)]~~ (r) the following members designated to serve four-year terms:

58 (i) a juvenile court judge, appointed by the chief justice, as presiding officer of the

59 Judicial Council;

60 (ii) a representative of the statewide association of public attorneys designated by the  
61 association's officers;

62 (iii) one member of the House of Representatives who is appointed by the speaker of  
63 the House of Representatives; and

64 (iv) one member of the Senate who is appointed by the president of the Senate.

65 (2) The governor shall appoint the remaining three members to four-year staggered  
66 terms as follows:

67 (a) one criminal defense attorney appointed from a list of three nominees submitted by  
68 the Utah State Bar Association;

69 (b) one representative of public education; and

70 (c) one citizen representative.

71 (3) In addition to the members designated under Subsections (1) and (2), the United  
72 States Attorney for the district of Utah may serve as a nonvoting member.

73 (4) In appointing the members under Subsection (2), the governor shall take into  
74 account the geographical makeup of the commission.
