10	This resolution relates to global climate change.
11	Highlighted Provisions:
12	This resolution:
13	 acknowledges that average global temperature and average Utah temperature have
14	increased over recent decades, and that there is some scientific consensus that a
15	cause for these increases may be human-caused emissions; and
16	 states that the Legislature and Governor will continue to base decisions regarding
17	state energy policies on the best scientific evidence available and will continue to
18	urge individuals and corporations to conserve energy.
19	Special Clauses:

22	Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah, the Governor concurring therein:
23	WHEREAS, average global temperatures and average Utah temperatures have
24	increased over recent decades;
25	WHEREAS, there is some scientific consensus that a cause for these temperature



26	increases is human-caused emissions, predominantly carbon dioxide and methane created by
27	the burning of fossil fuels, vehicle emissions, large buildings, inefficient lighting and heating,
28	and many other causes;
29	WHEREAS, continued increase in average global temperature may have some serious
30	and negative consequences;
31	WHEREAS, a continued increase in average Utah temperatures may also have negative
32	consequences including threats to the skiing industry, reduction in snowpack at lower altitudes,
33	and increased intensity of wildfires; and
34	WHEREAS, Utah also struggles with the health effects caused by air pollution during
35	winter inversion seasons, which are in part caused by the burning of fossil fuels, vehicle
36	emissions, large buildings, inefficient lighting and heating, and many other causes:
37	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah, the
38	Governor concurring therein, continue to base decisions regarding state energy policies on the
39	best scientific evidence available regarding local and global consequences for energy use.
40	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and the Governor continue to seek
41	energy policies that will protect the health of our state and planet, enlarge the economy of our
42	state, and keep energy affordable for our citizens.
43	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and Governor continue to
44	encourage individuals and corporations to conserve energy.
45	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and Governor will continue to work
46	with the state's federal delegation to seek policies that further these goals.
