LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill prohibits a political subdivision or law enforcement agency from imposing an arrest, citation, stop, or other quota on a peace officer.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ prohibits a political subdivision or law enforcement agency from:
 - requiring or directing a peace officer to meet an arrest, citation, stop, or other quota; or
 - transferring, promoting, disciplining, or taking any other action against a peace officer for reasons related to an arrest, citation, stop, or other quota ~~and~~

28 Section 1. Section 77-7-27 is enacted to read:

29 **77-7-27. Quotas for arrest, citation, stops, or other actions prohibited.**

31 (a) "Law enforcement agency" means an entity of the state, or a political subdivision of
32 the state, that exists primarily to prevent and detect crime and enforce criminal laws, statutes,
