10                   The Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Environment Interim Committee  
11 recommended this bill.

12                   **General Description:**

13                   This bill deals with the duties of the Legislative Water Development Commission.

14                   **Highlighted Provisions:**

15                   This bill:

- 16                   ▶ removes the sunset date for the Legislative Water Development Commission;
- 17                   ▶ authorizes the Legislative Water Development Commission to meet up to six times  
18 per calendar year without approval from the Legislative Management Committee;  
19 and
- 20                   ▶ makes technical changes.

32 Section 1. Section **63I-1-273** is amended to read:

36 [(2)] The instream flow water right for trout habitat established in Subsection

38 Section 2. Section **73-27-103** is amended to read:

39 **73-27-103. Duties of commission.**

40 (1) The commission shall consider and make recommendations to the Legislature and  
41 governor on the following issues:

42 (a) how the water needs of the state's growing municipal and industrial sectors will be  
43 met;

44 (b) what the impact of federal regulations and legislation will be on the ability of the  
45 state to manage and develop its compacted water rights;

46 (c) how the state will fund water projects;

47 (d) whether the state should become an owner and operator of water projects;

48 (e) how the state will encourage the implementation of water conservation programs;

49 and

50 (f) other water issues of statewide importance.

51 (2) The commission shall:

52 (a) consult with the Division of Water Resources and the Board of Water Resources  
53 regarding:

54 (i) recommendations for rules, criteria, targets, processes, and plans described in  
55 Subsection **73-10g-105**(3); and

56 (ii) the scope of any request for proposals that may be issued by the Division of Water  
57 Resources and Board of Water Resources to assist in creating the rules, criteria, targets,  
58 processes, and plans described in Subsection **73-10g-105**(3); and

59 (b) report the recommendations described in Subsection (2)(a) to the Natural  
60 Resources, Agriculture, and Environment Interim Committee and the Legislative Management  
61 Committee by October 30, 2016.

62 (3) The commission may:

63 (a) form one or more working groups from the membership of the commission to  
64 consider and study the issues described in this section[-]; and

65 (b) meet up to six times per calendar year without approval from the Legislative  
66 Management Committee.
