

8	General Description:
9	This bill requires the Department of Corrections and county jails to report on in-custody
10	deaths and opiate addiction treatment services.
11	Highlighted Provisions:
12	This bill:
13	 requires the Department of Corrections and county jails to report to the Commission
14	on Criminal and Juvenile Justice regarding:
15	 in-custody inmate deaths;
16	 treatment services for inmates with an opiate addiction; and
17	 prescriptions not dispensed to an inmate during incarceration; and
18	 requires the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice to compile the
19	information reported and submit the compilation to the Law Enforcement and
20	Criminal Justice Interim Committee.
