## FIREWORKS RESTRICTIONS

Representative **Marie H. Poulson** proposes the following amendments:

1. *Page 1, Lines 7 through 9:*

2. *Page 1, Lines 18 through 19:*

18           ▶       increases the areas within which a municipality or the state forester may prohibit the  
19 discharge of fireworks;

▶ allows a municipality to prohibit the discharge of fireworks within the entire municipality in certain circumstances;

3. *Page 8, Lines 226 through 228:*

226 15A-5-202.5(1)(b); {~~or~~}

227 [(b) in accordance with a municipal ordinance prohibiting]

228 (B) the negligent discharge of class C common state approved explosives {~~-~~} ; or

(C) the discharge of class C common state approved explosives in the entire municipality or metro township if the municipal or metro township legislative body makes a finding that conditions exist under which the discharge of fireworks poses an inordinate and extreme danger of fire, approves the prohibition in a public meeting, and notifies the county that the discharge of fireworks is prohibited within the municipality or metro township.

4. *Page 8, Lines 233 through 239:*

233           (6) If a municipal legislative body, the state forester, or a metro township legislative  
234 body provides a map to a county identifying an area in which the discharge of fireworks is  
235 prohibited due to a historical hazardous environmental condition under Subsection

236 15A-5-202.5(1)(b), or if a municipality or metro township notifies the county of a jurisdiction-wide prohibition under Subsection (5)(b)(ii)(C), the county shall, before June 1 of that same year:

237           (a) create a county-wide map, based on each map and notification the county has received,  
indicating

238 each area within the county in which fireworks are prohibited under Subsection (5)(b)(ii)(C) or
