Representative Ken Ivory proposes the following amendments:

- 1. Page 4, Lines 106 through 110:
  - 106 (c) "Trauma-informed" means a policy, procedure, program, or practice that
  - 107 demonstrates an ability to minimize retraumatization associated with the criminal and juvenile
  - 108 justice system { by recognizing the presence of trauma symptoms and acknowledging the role
  - 109 <u>that trauma plays in the life of a victim, a victim's family, agency staff, and others involved</u>
  - 110 with the criminal and juvenile justice system } .
- 2. Page 4, Lines 112 through 115:
  - 112 (2) (a) The commission shall create a committee known as the Multi-Disciplinary
