Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:			
Section 1. Section 63N-12-501 is amended to read:			
63N-12-501. Definitions.			
As used in this part:			
(1) "Center" means the Talent Ready Utah Center created in Section 63N-12-502.			
(2) "High quality professional learning" means the professional learning standards for			
teachers and principals described in Section 53G-11-303.			
(3) "Local education agency" means a school district, a charter school, or the Utah			
Schools for the Deaf and the Blind.			
(4) "Master plan" means the computer science education master plan described in			
Section 63N-12-505.			
[(2)] (5) "Talent ready board" means the Talent Ready Utah Board created in Section			
63N-12-503.			
[(3)] (6) "Workforce programs" means education or industry programs that facilitate			
training the state's workforce to meet industry demand.			
Section 2. Section <b>63N-12-505</b> is enacted to read:			
63N-12-505. Computer science education master plan.			
The talent ready board, in consultation with the center, shall develop a computer			
science education master plan that:			
(1) includes a statement of the objectives and goals of the master plan;			
(2) describes how the talent ready board will administer the Computer Science for Utah			
Grant Program created in Section 63N-12-506;			

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59	(3) provides guidance for local education agencies in implementing computer science
60	education opportunities for students in high school, middle school, and elementary school;
61	(4) integrates recommendations and best practices from private and public entities that
62	are seeking to improve and expand the opportunities for computer science education, including
63	the Expanding Computer Education Pathways Alliance; and
64	(5) makes recommendations to assist a local education agency in creating a local
65	education agency computer science plan described in Subsection 63N-12-506(5), including:
66	(a) providing recommendations regarding course offerings in computer science;
67	(b) providing recommendations regarding professional development opportunities in
68	computer science for licensed teachers;
69	(c) providing recommendations regarding curriculum software for computer science
70	courses;
71	(d) providing recommendations regarding assessment solutions to measure the learning
72	outcomes of students in computer science courses; and
73	(e) providing information regarding how a local education agency can receive technical
74	support from the talent ready board in providing computer science education opportunities for
75	students.
76	Section 3. Section <b>63N-12-506</b> is enacted to read:
77	63N-12-506. Computer Science for Utah Grant Program.
78	(1) As used in this section, "grant program" means the Computer Science for Utah
79	Grant Program created in Subsection (2).
80	(2) The Computer Science for Utah Grant Program is created to provide grants to
81	eligible local education agencies for improving computer science learning outcomes and course
82	offerings as demonstrated by:
83	(a) the creation and implementation of a local education agency computer science plan
84	as described in Subsection (7); and
85	(b) the effective implementation of approved courses and the provision of effective
86	training opportunities for licensed teachers.
87	(3) Subject to appropriations from the Legislature, the talent ready board shall
88	distribute to local education agencies money appropriated for the grant program in accordance
89	with this section.

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90	(4) The talent ready board shall:		
91	(a) solicit proposals from local education agency boards to receive money under the		
92	grant program; and		
93	(b) award grants to a local education agency board on behalf of a local education		
94	agency based on the criteria described in Subsection (6).		
95	(5) In administering the Computer Science for Utah Grant Program, the office, in		
96	consultation with the talent ready board, may make rules, in accordance with this part and Title		
97	63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, that:		
98	(a) describe the form and deadlines for a grant application by a local education agency		
99	under this section; and		
100	(b) describe the reporting requirements required by a local education agency after		
101	receiving a grant under this section.		
102	(6) In awarding a grant under Subsection (3), the talent ready board shall consider the		
103	effectiveness of the local education agency in creating and implementing a local education		
104	agency computer science plan as described in Subsection (7).		
105	(7) Each local education agency that seeks a grant as described in this section shall		
106	submit a written computer science plan, in a form approved by the talent ready board, that:		
107	(a) covers at least four years;		
108	(b) addresses the recommendations of the talent ready board's computer science		
109	education master plan described in Section 63N-12-505;		
110	(c) identifies targets for improved computer science offerings, student learning, and		
111	licensed teacher training;		
112	(d) describes a computer science professional development program and other		
113	opportunities for high quality professional learning for licensed teachers or individuals training		
114	to become licensed teachers;		
115	(e) provides a detailed budget, communications, and reporting structure for		
116	implementing the computer science plan;		
117	(f) commits to provide one computer science course offering, approved by the talent		
118	ready board, in every middle and high school within the local education agency;		
119	(g) commits to integrate computer science education into the curriculum of each		
120	elementary school within the local education agency; and		

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121	(h) includes any other requirement established by the office by rule, in consultation		
122	with the talent ready board, in accordance with this part and Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah		
123	Administrative Rulemaking Act.		
124	(8) Each local education agency that receives a grant as described in this section shall		
125	provide an annual written assessment to the talent ready board for each year that the local		
126	education agency receives a grant or expends grant money that includes:		
127	(a) how the grant money was used;		
128	(b) any improvements in the number and quality of computer science offerings		
129	provided by the local education agency and any increase in the number of licensed teachers		
130	providing computer science teaching to students;		
131	(c) any difficulties encountered during implementation of the local education agency's		
132	written computer science plan and steps that will be taken to address the difficulties; and		
133	(d) any other requirement established by the office by rule, in consultation with the		
134	talent ready board, in accordance with this part and Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative		
135	Rulemaking Act.		
136	(9) (a) The talent ready board shall review each annual written assessment described in		
137	Subsection (8).		
138	(b) As a result of the review described in Subsection (9)(a), the board may:		
139	(i) provide recommendations to improve the progress of the local education agency in		
140	meeting the objectives of the written computer science plan;		
141	(ii) not renew or extend a grant under this section; or		
142	(iii) take other action to assist the local education agency.		
143	Section 4. Appropriation.		
144	The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,		
145	2019, and ending June 30, 2020. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for		
146	fiscal year 2020. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures		
147	Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts		
148	indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.
