26	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:



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Section 1. Section 4-4-103 is amended to read:

28	4-4-103. Definitions.
29	As used in this chapter:
30	(1) "Addled" or "white rot" means putrid or rotten.
31	(2) "Adherent yolk" means the yolk has settled to one side and become fastened to the
32	shell.
33	(3) "Albumen" means the white of an egg.
34	(4) "Black rot" means the egg has deteriorated to such an extent that the whole interior
35	presents a blackened appearance.
36	(5) "Black spot" means mold or bacteria have developed in isolated areas inside the
37	shell.
38	(6) "Blood ring" means bacteria have developed to such an extent that blood is formed.
39	(7) "Candling" means the act of determining the condition of an egg by holding it
40	before a strong light in such a way that the light shines through the egg and reveals the egg's
41	contents.
42	(8) "Moldy" means mold spores have formed within the shell.
43	(9) "Shell egg" means an egg in the shell as distinguished from a dried or powdered
44	egg.
45	(10) "Small producer" means a producer of shell eggs:
46	(a) having less than 3,000 layers;
47	(b) selling only to an ultimate consumer; and
48	(c) who is exempt from 21 C.F.R. Chapter 1, Part 118, Production, Storage, and
49	Transportation of Shell Eggs.
50	(11) "Ultimate consumer" means a household consumer, restaurant, institution, or any
51	other person who has purchased or received shell eggs or egg products for consumption.
52	Section 2. Section 4-4-107 is enacted to read:
53	4-4-107. Exemptions from regulation.
54	(1) Except as provided in this section, a small producer and the shell eggs produced by
55	a small producer is exempt from regulation by the department.
56	(2) The Department of Health has the authority to investigate foodborne illness.
57	(3) The department may assist, consult, or inspect shell eggs when requested by a small
58	producer.

59	(4) Nothing in this section affects the authority of the Department of Health or the
60	department to certify, license, regulate, or inspect food or food products that are not exempt
61	from certification, licensing regulation, or inspection under this section.
