LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill requires ~~{a distribution electrical cooperative and}~~ an electrical corporation to provide each nonresidential customer online access to usage data in certain circumstances.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ if available and requested by the customer, requires ~~{each distribution electrical cooperative and}~~ an electrical corporation to provide ~~{each}~~ the nonresidential customer access to the ~~{customer's usage data:~~

—• ~~through an online Internet portal; and~~

—• ~~showing the customer's usage in intervals of 15 minutes or less; and~~

—▶ ~~makes technical changes}~~ customer's usage data in:

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- 15 minute intervals; or
- the shortest interval available through existing meters; and
- ▶ allows the electrical corporation to charge the customer the costs associated with providing the usage data to the customer.

54-3-2, as last amended by Laws of Utah 1996, Chapter 170

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **54-3-2** is amended to read:

54-3-2. Schedules of rates and classification -- Right of inspection -- Changes by commission -- Online consumer access to usage data.

(1) Under the rules and regulations made by the commission, ~~[every]~~ each public utility, shall file with the commission within the time and in the form as the commission may designate, and shall print and keep open to public inspection, schedules showing all rates, tolls, rentals, charges, and classifications collected or enforced, or to be collected or enforced, together with all rules, regulations, contracts, privileges, and facilities which in any manner affect or relate to rates, tolls, rentals, charges, classifications, or service.

(2) Except for motor carriers exempted under federal law, nothing in this section shall prevent the commission from approving or fixing rates, tolls, rentals, or charges from time to time greater, or less, than those shown by the schedules.

(3) The commission shall have power, in its discretion, to determine and prescribe, by order, changes in the form of the schedules referred to in this section as it may find expedient, and to modify the requirements of any of its orders or rules or regulations in respect to any matters described in this section.

(4) (a) ~~{Each distribution electrical cooperative and}~~ If requested by a nonresidential customer, and to the extent available through existing meters, each electrical corporation shall

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provide ~~each~~ the nonresidential customer access to the customer's usage data.

(b) Each ~~{ distribution electrical cooperative and }~~ electrical corporation shall provide the access described in Subsection (4)(a) ~~;~~:

~~— (i) broken down into { usage intervals of 15 minutes or less; and~~

~~— (ii) through an online Internet portal.~~

~~;~~:

(i) 15 minute intervals; or

(ii) the shortest interval available through existing meters.

(c) If incremental costs are associated with providing the access described in this Subsection (4), the electrical corporation may charge the customer an amount determined by the electrical corporation's governing authority, as defined in Section 54-15-102.
