ARTICLE X, SECTION 3

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah, two-thirds of all members elected to each of the two houses voting in favor thereof:

Section 1. It is proposed to amend Utah Constitution, Article X, Section 3, to read:

Article X, Section 3. [State Board of Education.]

(1) (a) The general control and supervision of the public education system shall be vested in a State Board of Education consisting of nine members, appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Senate. [The membership of the board shall be established { a} and { shall be} elected { or appointed,} as provided by statute.]

(b) The term of a board member is six years, and no member may serve more than two full terms.

(2) The State Board of Education shall appoint a State Superintendent of Public Instruction who shall be the executive officer of the board.

Section 2. Submittal to voters.

The lieutenant governor is directed to submit this proposed amendment to the voters of the state at the next regular general election in the manner provided by law.

Section 3. Contingent effective date.

If the amendment proposed by this joint resolution is approved by a majority of those voting on it at the next regular general election, the amendment shall take effect on January 1, 2021.
