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(8) A volunteer participating in the stewardship program may not receive

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compensation, benefits, per diem allowance, or travel expenses for the volunteer's service.

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(9) The division may accept gifts, grants, donations, or contributions from any source

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to assist the division in the administration of the stewardship program.

(10) Nothing in this section may be construed to alter or affect the division's duties

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under Section 9-8-404.
