9	General Description:
10	This bill amends the Effective Teachers in High Poverty Schools Incentive Program.
11	Highlighted Provisions:
12	This bill:
13	 amends the definition of eligible teacher to allow teachers of kindergarten through
14	grade 3 to become eligible for the Effective Teachers in High Poverty Schools
15	Incentive Program;
16	increases the amount of the annual salary bonus; and
17	 guarantees the portion of the annual salary bonus paid to an eligible teacher by the
18	state board.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

28	Section 1. Section 53F-2-513 is amended to read:
29	53F-2-513. Effective Teachers in High Poverty Schools Incentive Program
30	Salary bonus Evaluation.
31	(1) As used in this section:
32	(a) "Cohort" means a group of students, defined by the year in which the group enters
33	grade 1.
34	(b) "Eligible teacher" means a teacher who:
35	(i) is employed as a teacher in a high poverty school at the time the teacher is
36	considered by the state board for a salary bonus; and
37	[(ii) achieves a median growth percentile of 70 or higher:]
38	[(A) a full school year before the school year the eligible teacher is being considered by
39	the state board for a salary bonus under this section, regardless of whether the teacher was
40	employed the previous school year by a high poverty school or a different public school; and]
41	(ii) a full school year before the school year the eligible teacher is being considered by
42	the state board for a salary bonus under this section, regardless of whether the teacher was
43	employed the previous year by a high poverty school or a different public school, either:
44	[(B)] (A) achieves a median growth percentile of 70 or higher while teaching at any
45	public school in the state a course for which a standards assessment is administered as
46	described in Section 53E-4-303[-]; or
47	(B) achieves at least 85% of students whose progress is assessed as typical or better at
48	the end of the year assessment while teaching at any public school in the state at which a
49	benchmark assessment is administered as described in Section 53F-2-503.
50	(c) "High poverty school" means a public school:
51	(i) in which:
52	(A) more than 20% of the enrolled students are classified as children affected by
53	intergenerational poverty; or
54	(B) 70% or more of the enrolled students qualify for free or reduced lunch; or
55	(ii) (A) that has previously met the criteria described in Subsection (1)(c)(i)(A) and for
56	each school year since meeting that criteria at least 15% of the enrolled students at the public
57	school have been classified as children affected by intergenerational poverty; or
58	(B) that has previously met the criteria described in Subsection (1)(c)(i)(B) and for

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- each school year since meeting that criteria at least 60% of the enrolled students at the public
 school have qualified for free or reduced lunch.
 - (d) "Intergenerational poverty" means the same as that term is defined in Section 35A-9-102.
 - (e) "Median growth percentile" means a number that describes the comparative effectiveness of a teacher in helping the teacher's students achieve growth in a year by identifying the median student growth percentile of all the students a teacher instructs.
 - (f) "Program" means the Effective Teachers in High Poverty Schools Incentive Program created in Subsection (2).
 - (g) "Student growth percentile" is a number that describes where a student ranks in comparison to the student's cohort.
- 70 (2) (a) The Effective Teachers in High Poverty Schools Incentive Program is created to provide an annual salary bonus for an eligible teacher.
 - (b) The state board shall make rules for:
 - (i) the administration of the program;
 - (ii) payment of a salary bonus; and
- 75 (iii) application requirements.
 - (c) The state board shall make an annual salary bonus payment in a fiscal year that begins on July 1, 2017, and each fiscal year thereafter in which money is appropriated for the program.
 - (3) (a) Subject to future budget constraints, the Legislature shall annually appropriate money to fund the program.
 - (b) Money appropriated for the program shall include money for the following employer-paid benefits:
 - (i) social security; and
- 84 (ii) Medicare.
 - (4) (a) (i) A charter school or school district school shall annually apply to the state board on behalf of an eligible teacher for an eligible teacher to receive an annual salary bonus each year that the teacher is an eligible teacher.
- 88 (ii) A teacher need not be an eligible teacher in consecutive years to receive the so increased annual salary bonus described in Subsection (4)(b).

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90	(b) The annual salary bonus for an eligible teacher is [\$5,000] \$7,000.
91	(c) A public school that applies on behalf of an eligible teacher under Subsection
92	(4)(a)(i) shall pay half of the salary bonus described in Subsection (4)(b) each year the eligible
93	teacher is awarded the salary bonus.
94	(d) The state board shall award a salary bonus to an eligible teacher based on the order
95	that an application from a public school on behalf of the eligible teacher is received.
96	(5) The state board shall:
97	(a) determine if a teacher is an eligible teacher; and
98	(b) verify, as needed, the determinations made under Subsection (5)(a) with the school
99	district and school district administrators.
100	(6) The state board shall:
101	(a) distribute money from the program to school districts and charter schools in
102	accordance with this section and state board rule; and
103	(b) include the employer-paid benefits described in Subsection (3)(b) in addition to the
104	salary bonus amount described in Subsection (4)(b).
105	(7) Money received from the program shall be used by a school district or charter
106	school to provide an annual salary bonus equal to the amount specified in Subsection (4)(b) for
107	each eligible teacher and to pay affiliated employer-paid benefits described in Subsection
108	(3)(b).
109	(8) (a) After the third year salary bonus payments are made, and each succeeding year,
110	the state board shall evaluate the extent to which a salary bonus described in this section
111	improves recruitment and retention of effective teachers in high poverty schools by at least:
112	(i) surveying teachers who receive the salary bonus; and
113	(ii) examining turnover rates of teachers who receive the salary bonus compared to
114	teachers who do not receive the salary bonus.
115	(b) Each year that the state board conducts an evaluation described in Subsection
116	(8)(a), the state board shall, in accordance with Section 68-3-14, submit a report on the results
117	of the evaluation to the Education Interim Committee on or before November 30.

(b) how the teacher's median growth percentile is calculated.

(9) A public school shall annually notify a teacher:

(a) of the teacher's median growth percentile; and

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(10) Notwithstanding this section, if the appropriation for the program <u>under this</u>
section is insufficient to cover the costs associated with salary bonuses, [the state board may
limit or reduce a salary bonus.] the state board shall use funds appropriated under Title 53E,
Chapter 5, Part 3, School Turnaround and Leadership Development, to cover the costs.
