	Section 1. Section 49-11-1301 is amended to read:		
	49-11-1301. Definitions.		
	As used in this part:		
	(1) "Amortization rate" means the amortization rate, as defined in Section 49-11-102,		
	to be applied to the system that would have covered the retiree if the retiree's part-time position		
	were considered to be an eligible, full-time position within that system.		
	(2) "Full-time" means a:		
	(a) regular full-time employee whose term of employment for a participating employer		
	contemplates continued employment during a fiscal or calendar year and whose employment		
	normally requires an average of 40 hours or more per week and who receives benefits normally		
	provided by the participating employer;		
	(b) teacher whose term of employment for a participating employer contemplates		
(continued employment during a school year and who teaches full time;		
	(c) firefighter service employee whose employment normally requires an average of		
	2,080 hours of regularly scheduled firefighter service per year; and		
	(d) public safety service employee whose employment normally requires an average of		
	2,080 hours of regularly scheduled public safety service per year.		
	(3) "Half-time" means [a]:		
	(a) <u>a</u> regular employee whose term of employment for a participating employer		
	contemplates continued employment during a fiscal or calendar year and whose employment		
]	normally requires an average of 20 hours per week and who receives benefits normally		
	provided by the participating employer;		
	(b) \underline{a} teacher whose term of employment for a participating employer contemplates		
	continued employment during a school year and who teaches half time;		
	(c) <u>a</u> firefighter service employee whose employment normally requires an average of		
	1,040 hours of regularly scheduled firefighter service per year; [and]		

39	(d) <u>a public safety service employee whose employment normally requires an average</u>
60	of 1,040 hours of regularly scheduled public safety service per year[-]; and
61	(e) for a retiree employed before retirement as a public safety service employee or a
62	firefighter service employee in a position for which the participating employer established a
63	regularly scheduled work period in excess of 2,080 hours per year, one-half of that regularly
64	scheduled work period as long as the retiree has continuing employment in that same position.
65	(4) "Phased retirement" means continuing employment:
66	(a) on a half-time basis of a retiree with the same participating employer following the
67	retiree's retirement date while the retiree receives a reduced retirement allowance[:]; or
68	(b) on a three-quarter time basis of a retiree with the same participating employer
69	following the retiree's retirement date while the retiree receives a reduced retirement allowance
70	if the retiree is employed as a public safety service employee or a firefighter service employee.
71	(5) "Three-quarter time" means:
72	(a) a firefighter service employee whose employment normally requires an average of
73	1,560 hours of regularly scheduled firefighter service per year;
74	(b) a public safety service employee whose employment normally requires an average
75	of 1,560 hours of regularly scheduled public safety service per year; and
76	(c) for a retiree who was employed before retirement as a public safety service
77	employee or a firefighter service employee in a position for which the participating employer
78	established a regularly scheduled work period in excess of 2,080 hours per year, three quarters
79	of that regularly scheduled work period as long as the retiree has continuing employment in
80	that same position.
81	Section 2. Section 49-11-1303 is amended to read:
82	49-11-1303. Phased retirement Eligibility Restrictions Amortization rate.
83	(1) A retiree is eligible for employment with only one position for only one
84	participating employer under phased retirement following the retiree's retirement date if:
85	(a) the retiree:
86	(i) is eligible to retire and retires in accordance with this title;
87	(ii) has been employed full time, for not less than four years immediately before the
88	retiree's retirement date;
89	(iii) for a retiree employed as a public safety service employee or a firefighter service

90	employee, is at least 50 years old;
91	[(iii)] (iv) completes and submits all required retirement forms to the office; and
92	[(iv)] (v) prior to the retiree's retirement date, completes and submits all required
93	phased retirement forms to the office; and
94	(b) the retiree and the participating employer enter into an agreement described under
95	Section 49-11-1304.
96	(2) A retiree shall begin phased retirement employment after the retiree's retirement
97	date but no later than 120 days after the retiree's retirement date.
98	(3) [For] Except as provided in Subsection (4), for the period of the phased retirement:
99	(a) the retiree receives 50% of the retiree's monthly allowance;
100	(b) the participating employer employs the retiree on a half-time basis;
101	(c) a participating employer that employs the retiree shall contribute the amortization
102	rate to the office [the amortization rate];
103	(d) the retiree or an alternate payee may not receive an annual cost-of-living adjustment
104	to the retiree's or alternate payee's allowance;
105	(e) any death benefits payable to a surviving spouse or other beneficiary shall be paid
106	based on 100% of the retiree's retirement allowance;
107	(f) the retiree may not receive any employer provided retirement benefits, service credit
108	accruals, or any retirement related contributions from the participating employer; and
109	(g) except as specified under this section, a retiree working under phased retirement
110	shall be treated in the same manner as any other part-time employee working a similar position
111	and number of hours with the participating employer, including:
112	(i) any non-retirement related benefits;
113	(ii) leave benefits;
114	(iii) medical benefits; and
115	(iv) other benefits.
116	(4) (a) If a retiree is employed as a public safety service employee or a firefighter
117	service employee, for the period of the phased retirement the requirements of Subsection (3) or
118	(4)(b) are satisfied.
119	(b) For the period of the phased retirement:
120	(i) the retiree is employed as a public safety service employee or a firefighter service

121	employee;	
122	(ii) the retiree receives 25% of the retiree's monthly allowance;	
123	(iii) the participating employer employs the retiree on a three-quarter time basis;	
124	(iv) a participating employer that employs the retiree shall contribute to the office the	
125	certified contribution rate applicable to the system that would have covered the retiree if the	
126	retiree's part-time position were considered to be an eligible, full-time position within the	
127	system;	
128	(v) the retiree or an alternate payee may not receive an annual cost-of-living adjustment	
129	to the retiree's or alternate payee's allowance;	
130	(vi) any death benefits payable to a surviving spouse or other beneficiary shall be paid	
131	based on 100% of the retiree's retirement allowance;	
132	(vii) the retiree may not receive any employer provided retirement benefits, service	
133	credit accruals, or any retirement related contributions from the participating employer; and	
134	(viii) except as specified under this section, a retiree working under phased retirement	
135	shall be treated in the same manner as any other part-time employee working a similar position	
136	and number of hours with the participating employer, including:	
137	(A) any non-retirement related benefits;	
138	(B) leave benefits;	
139	(C) medical benefits; and	
140	(D) other benefits.	
141	$\left[\frac{(4)}{(5)}\right]$ The office shall begin paying 100% of the retiree's retirement allowance on	
142	the first day of the month following the month in which the office receives written notification	
143	and any required supporting documentation that the retiree's phased retirement has been	
144	irrevocably terminated.

147	If a retiree is employed under <u>a phased retirement agreement</u> under this [section] part,	
148	the termination date of the phased retirement employment, as confirmed in writing by the	
149	participating employer, is considered the retiree's retirement date for the purpose of calculating	
150	the separation requirement under Subsection 49-11-1204(2).
