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**LONG TITLE**

**General Description:**

This bill requires the State Board of Regents to study and make recommendations for providing public safety services on college and university campuses.

**Highlighted Provisions:**

This bill:

▶ defines terms;

▶ requires the State Board of Regents to:

• coordinate with government and community organizations to study and make recommendations for providing public safety services on college and university campuses; and

• present a final report of the study and recommendations to the Education Interim Committee and the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Interim Committee.

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32 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

33 Section 1. Section [53B-28-402](#) is enacted to read:

34 **[53B-28-402](#). Campus safety study -- Report to Legislature.**

35 (1) As used in this section:

36 (a) "Campus law enforcement" means a unit of an institution that provides public  
37 safety services.

38 (b) (i) "Institution" means an institution of higher education or a technical college.

39 (ii) "Institution" includes an institution's campus law enforcement.

40 (c) "Institution of higher education" means an institution described in Subsections  
41 [53B-1-102](#)(1)(a)(ii) through (ix).

42 (d) "Local district" means the same as that term is defined in Section [17B-1-102](#).

43 (e) "Local law enforcement" means a state or local law enforcement agency other than  
44 campus law enforcement.

45 (f) "Public safety services" means police services, security services, dispatch services,  
46 emergency services, or other similar services.

47 (g) "Sexual violence" means the same as that term is defined in Section [53B-28-301](#).

48 (h) "Special service district" means the same as that term is defined in Section  
49 [17D-1-102](#).

50 (i) "Student" means the same as that term is defined in Section [53B-28-301](#).

51 (j) "Student organization" means the same as that term is defined in Section  
52 [53B-28-401](#).

53 (k) "Technical college" means the same as that term is defined in Section [53B-1-101.5](#).

54 (2) The board shall:

55 (a) study issues related to providing public safety services on institution campuses,  
56 including:

57 (i) policies and practices for hiring, supervision, and firing of campus law enforcement  
58 officers;

59 (ii) training of campus law enforcement in responding to incidents of sexual violence  
60 or other crimes reported by or involving a student, including training related to lethality or  
61 similar assessments;

62 (iii) how campus law enforcement and local law enforcement respond to reports of  
63 incidents of sexual violence or other crimes reported by or involving a student, including  
64 supportive measures for victims and disciplinary actions for perpetrators;

65 (iv) training provided to faculty, staff, students, and student organizations on campus  
66 safety and prevention of sexual violence;

67 (v) roles, responsibilities, jurisdiction, and authority of local law enforcement and  
68 campus law enforcement, including authority based on:

69 (A) the type of public safety services provided; or

70 (B) geographic boundaries;

71 (vi) how an institution and local law enforcement coordinate to respond to on-campus  
72 and off-campus incidents requiring public safety services, including:

73 (A) legal requirements or restrictions affecting coordination;

74 (B) agreements, practices, or procedures governing coordination between an institution  
75 and local law enforcement, including mutual support, sharing information, or dispatch  
76 management;

77 (C) any issues that may affect the timeliness of a response to an on-campus or  
78 off-campus incident reported by or involving a student;

79 (vii) infrastructure, staffing, and equipment considerations that impact the effectiveness  
80 of campus law enforcement or local law enforcement responses to an on-campus or off-campus  
81 incident reported by or involving a student;

82 (viii) the benefits and disadvantages of an institution employing campus law  
83 enforcement compared to local law enforcement providing public safety services on an  
84 institution campus;

85 (ix) an institution's compliance with federal and state crime statistic reporting  
86 requirements;

87 (x) how an institution informs faculty, staff, and students about a crime or emergency  
88 on campus;

89 (xi) national best practices for providing public safety services on institution campuses,

90 including differences in best practices based on the size, infrastructure, location, and other  
 91 relevant characteristics of a college or university; and

92 (xii) any other issue the board determines is relevant to the study;

93 (b) make recommendations for providing public safety services on institution campuses  
 94 statewide;

95 (c) produce a final report of the study described in this section, including the  
 96 recommendations described in Subsection (2)(b); and

97 (d) in accordance with Section 68-3-14, present the final report described in Subsection  
 98 (2)(c) to the Education Interim Committee and the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice  
 99 Interim Committee at or before the committees' November 2021 meetings.
