	(1) The division shall meet regularly with:
	(a) elected officials of Indian Tribal Nations located in whole or in part in the state; or
	(b) individuals designated by elected officials of the Indian Tribal Nations described in

32	coordinate and attend a joint meeting of the representatives of tribal governments listed in

92	(iii) rules made by the Division of Finance pursuant to Sections 63A-3-106 and
93	63A-3-107.
94	(e) For a meeting described in Subsection (2)(a), only the individuals described in
95	Subsection (2)(b) may receive per diem and expenses, as provided in Subsection (2)(d).
96	(3) The division may meet as necessary with Native American Indian groups other than
97	tribal governments representing the interests of Native American Indians who are citizens of

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the state residing on or off reservation land.
