9   **General Description:**

28           (1) In relation to the Utah Transparency Advisory Board, on January 1, 2025:

29           (a) Subsection **63A-1-201**(1) is repealed;

30 (b) Subsection 63A-1-202(2)(c), the language that states "using criteria established by  
31 the board" is repealed;

32 (c) Section 63A-1-203 is repealed;

33 (d) Subsections 63A-1-204(1) and (2), the language that states "After consultation with  
34 the board, and" is repealed; and

- 144 59-7-610 or 59-10-1007, the machinery or equipment is purchased on or before December 31,

- 146 (B) for an expenditure described in Subsection 59-7-610(1)(b) or 59-10-1007(1)(b), the
- 147 expenditure is made on or before December 31, 2020.
