33	Section 1. Section 53B-28-402 is enacted to read:
34	53B-28-402. Campus safety study Report to Legislature.
35	(1) As used in this section:
36	(a) "Campus law enforcement" means a unit of an institution that provides public
37	safety services.
38	(b) (i) "Institution" means an institution of higher education or a technical college.
39	(ii) "Institution" includes an institution's campus law enforcement.
40	(c) "Institution of higher education" means an institution described in Subsections
41	53B-1-102(1)(a)(ii) through (ix).

60	or other crimes reported by or involving a student, including training related to lethality or
61	similar assessments;
62	(iii) how campus law enforcement and local law enforcement respond to reports of
63	incidents of sexual violence or other crimes reported by or involving a student, including
64	supportive measures for victims and disciplinary actions for perpetrators;
65	(iv) training provided to faculty, staff, students, and student organizations on campus
66	safety and prevention of sexual violence;
67	(v) roles, responsibilities, jurisdiction, and authority of local law enforcement and
68	campus law enforcement, including authority based on:
69	(A) the type of public safety services provided; or
70	(B) geographic boundaries;
71	(vi) how an institution and local law enforcement coordinate to respond to on-campus
72	and off-campus incidents requiring public safety services, including:
73	(A) legal requirements or restrictions affecting coordination;
74	(B) agreements, practices, or procedures governing coordination between an institution
75	and local law enforcement, including mutual support, sharing information, or dispatch
76	management;
77	(C) any issues that may affect the timeliness of a response to an on-campus or
78	off-campus incident reported by or involving a student;
79	(vii) infrastructure, staffing, and equipment considerations that impact the effectiveness
80	of campus law enforcement or local law enforcement responses to an on-campus or off-campus
81	incident reported by or involving a student;
82	(viii) the benefits and disadvantages of an institution employing campus law
83	enforcement compared to local law enforcement providing public safety services on an
84	institution campus;
85	(ix) an institution's compliance with federal and state crime statistic reporting
86	requirements;
87	(x) how an institution informs faculty, staff, and students about a crime or emergency
88	on campus;
89	(xi) national best practices for providing public safety services on institution campuses.

93	(b) make recommendations for providing public safety services on institution campuses

98	(2)(c) to the Education Interim Committee and the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice
