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7 **LONG TITLE**

8 **General Description:**

9 This bill addresses fire and rescue training programs.

10 **Highlighted Provisions:**

11 This bill:

12 ▶ requires Utah Valley University to operate a fire and rescue training program, with  
13 advice and support from the Utah Fire Prevention Board;

14 ▶ repeals provisions relating to the Utah Fire Prevention Board's responsibility to  
15 establish a fire academy;

16 ▶ modifies provisions relating to an account used to support operations of the State  
17 Fire Marshal Division;

18 ▶ requires the Utah Fire Prevention Board to provide technical expertise, advice, and  
19 support to Utah Valley University with respect to the fire and rescue training  
20 program;

21 ▶ requires Utah Valley University to provide the program without cost to designated  
22 individuals;

23 ▶ requires Utah Valley University and the Utah Fire Prevention Board to enter into a  
24 contract to define the terms of their relationship relative to the fire and rescue  
25 training program; and

26 ▶ requires Utah Valley University and the Utah Fire Prevention Board to report on the  
27 fire and rescue training program to legislative committees.

52 Section 1. Section **53-7-204** is amended to read:

53 **53-7-204. Duties of Utah Fire Prevention Board -- Unified Code Analysis Council**  
 54 **-- Local administrative duties.**

- 55 (1) The board shall:
  - 56 (a) administer the state fire code as the standard in the state;
  - 57 (b) subject to the state fire code, make rules in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3,
- 58 Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act:

- 59 (i) establishing standards for the prevention of fire and for the protection of life and  
60 property against fire and panic in any:
  - 61 (A) publicly owned building, including all public and private schools, colleges, and  
62 university buildings;
  - 63 (B) building or structure used or intended for use as an asylum, a mental hospital, a  
64 hospital, a sanitarium, a home for the elderly, an assisted living facility, a children's home or  
65 day care center, or any building or structure used for a similar purpose; or
  - 66 (C) place of assemblage where 50 or more persons may gather together in a building,  
67 structure, tent, or room for the purpose of amusement, entertainment, instruction, or education;
- 68 (ii) establishing safety and other requirements for placement and discharge of display

184 Section 3. Section **53-7-504** is amended to read:

185 **53-7-504. Offenses -- Civil penalties -- Penalty money to be deposited into the Fire**  
186 **Prevention Support Account.**

187 (1) (a) A person may not sell, offer for sale, or distribute a novelty lighter in this state.

188 (b) A person may not import a novelty lighter into this state for the purpose of selling  
189 or distributing the novelty lighter within this state.

190 (c) A person may not possess a novelty lighter in inventory for the purpose of selling or  
191 distributing the novelty lighter within this state.

192 (2) (a) The state fire marshal may assess a civil penalty against a person who violates  
193 Subsection (1) in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 4, Administrative Procedures Act.

194 (b) The civil penalty for a violation of Subsection (1) may not exceed:

195 (i) \$10,000 for the importation of novelty lighters;

196 (ii) \$1,000 if the person acts as a wholesaler of novelty lighters or distributes novelty  
197 lighters by means other than distribution directly to consumers; and

198 (iii) \$500 if the person is:

199 (A) a retail seller of novelty lighters; or

200 (B) a person distributing novelty lighters, other than as a manufacturer, importer, or  
201 wholesaler.

202 (3) If a person continues to violate this section after the state fire marshal gives the  
203 person written notice of a violation, each day that the violation continues after written notice is  
204 given is a separate offense subject to a civil penalty.

205 (4) (a) For purposes of imposing civil penalties, it is prima facie evidence that a lighter  
206 is a novelty lighter if the lighter is listed by the state fire marshal as a novelty lighter under  
207 Section **53-7-503**, or is of a class or type of lighter listed by the state fire marshal as a novelty  
208 lighter.

209 (b) Listing by the state fire marshal is not a requirement for a determination that a  
210 lighter is a novelty lighter.

211 (5) All money collected from civil penalties under this section shall be deposited [in]  
212 into the Fire [Academy] Prevention Support Account created in Section **53-7-204.2**.

213 (6) A person may seek judicial review of a final agency action under this part as

214 provided in Title 63G, Chapter 4, Administrative Procedures Act.

271 Section 5. Section 53B-29-101 is enacted to read:

272 **CHAPTER 29. UTAH VALLEY UNIVERSITY**

273 **Part 1. General Provisions**

274 **53B-29-101. Title.**

275 This chapter is known as "Utah Valley University."

276 Section 6. Section **53B-29-201** is enacted to read:

277 **Part 2. Fire and Rescue Training Program**

278 **53B-29-201. Definitions.**

279 As used in this part:

280 (1) "Fire and rescue training program" means the program described in Section  
281 53B-29-202.

282 (2) "Fire board" means the Utah Fire Prevention Board, created in Section 53-7-203.

283 Section 7. Section **53B-29-202** is enacted to read:

284 **53B-29-202. Fire prevention, education, and training program.**

285 (1) With technical advice and support from the fire board, Utah Valley University shall  
286 operate a statewide fire and rescue service training program that:

287 (a) provides instruction, training, and testing for:

288 (i) Utah Valley University students; and

289 (ii) firefighters and emergency rescue personnel throughout the state, whether paid or  
290 volunteer;

291 (b) explores new methods of firefighting, fire training, and fire prevention;

292 (c) provides training for fire and arson detection and investigation;

293 (d) provides training to students, firefighters, and emergency rescue personnel on how  
294 to conduct public education programs to promote fire safety;

295 (e) provides for certification of firefighters, pump operators, instructors, officers, and  
296 rescue personnel; and

297 (f) provides facilities and props for teaching firefighting and emergency rescue skills.

298 (2) Utah Valley University shall ensure that the curriculum, training, and facilities  
299 offered in the fire and rescue training program are sufficient to allow individuals who  
300 successfully complete the program to receive applicable certification as a firefighter or  
301 emergency rescue professional.

302 (3) Utah Valley University and the fire board shall consult together regarding:

303 (a) the development and content of the curriculum and training of the fire and rescue  
304 training program;

305 (b) the identification of individuals who will be permitted to participate in the fire and  
306 rescue program without cost; and

307 (c) the establishment of certification standards and requirements.

308 (4) Utah Valley University shall allow individuals designated by the fire board to  
309 participate in and complete the fire and rescue training program without cost and to receive  
310 applicable certification.

311 (5) Utah Valley University and the fire board shall by contract establish terms to:

312 (a) define the scope and content of the fire and rescue training program;

313 (b) identify the fire and rescue personnel throughout the state who will be permitted to  
314 participate in the fire and rescue training program without cost; and

315 (c) define other aspects of the relationship between Utah Valley University and the fire  
316 board relating to the fire and rescue training program that are mutually beneficial.

317 Section 8. Section **53B-29-203** is enacted to read:

318 **53B-29-203. Reporting requirement.**

319 In 2023, no later than October 31, 2023, Utah Valley University and the fire board shall  
320 report to the Education Interim Committee, the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Interim  
321 Committee, and the Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee of the Legislature about:

322 (1) the operation of the fire and rescue training program, including successes and  
323 challenges associated with the operation of the fire and rescue training program; and

324 (2) the positive aspects of and any concerns relating to the relationship between Utah  
325 Valley University and the fire board with respect to the fire and rescue training program.

326 Section 9. **Appropriation.**

327 The Legislature authorizes the State Division of Finance to transfer the following  
328 amounts between the following funds or accounts as indicated. Expenditures and outlays from  
329 the funds or accounts to which the money is transferred must be authorized by an  
330 appropriation.

337 Section 9a. **Operating and Capital Budgets.**

338 The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
339 2020 and ending June 30, 2021. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for  
340 fiscal year 2021. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures  
341 Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts

353 The Legislature intends that Utah Valley University use the money appropriated in this  
354 bill to fund the fire and rescue training program described in Section [53B-29-202](#).
