Mr. President,

The Business and Labor Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.B. 86**, ADULT AUTISM TREATMENT PROGRAM, by Representative C. Hall, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 5, Lines 124 through 126:
  - 124 (1) The Adult Autism Treatment Advisory Committee created in Section 26-1-7 shall
  - 125 <u>consist of</u> {<u>five</u>} <u>six</u> members appointed by the governor to two-year terms as <u>follows:</u>
  - 126 (a) one individual who:
- 2. Page 5, Lines 131 through 142:
  - 131 (i) employed by the department; and
  - 132 (ii) has professional experience with the treatment of autism spectrum disorder; {and }\_\_\_\_\_
  - 133 (c) three individuals who have firsthand experience with autism spectrum disorders and
  - 134 <u>the effects, diagnosis, treatment, and rehabilitation of autism spectrum disorders,</u> <u>including:</u>
  - 135 (i) family members of an adult with an autism spectrum disorder;
  - 136 <u>(ii) representatives of an association that advocates for adults with an autism</u> spectrum
  - 137 <u>disorder; and</u>

- 138 (iii) specialists or professionals who work with adults with an autism spectrum
- 139 <u>disorder</u> { \_\_\_ } <u>\_\_\_ ; and</u> <u>(d) one individual who is a health insurance professional and has a knowledge of</u> <u>autism benefits and therapy that are typically covered by the health insurance</u> <u>industry.</u>
- 140 (2) (a) Notwithstanding Subsection (1), the governor shall, at the time of appointment
- 141 <u>or reappointment, adjust the length of terms to ensure the terms of members are staggered</u> so
- 142 that approximately half of the advisory committee is appointed every year.
