Mr. Speaker,

The Business and Labor Committee recommends **H.B. 297**, YURT AMENDMENTS, by Representative B. Brammer, be replaced and reports a favorable recommendation on **1st Sub. H.B. 297**, YURT AMENDMENTS with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 6, Lines 172 through 178:
  - (ii) "Remote yurt" means a membrane-covered frame structure that:
  - (A) is no larger than 710 square feet;
  - (B) is not used as a permanent residence;
  - (C) is located in an unincorporated county area that is not zoned for residential,
  - 176 commercial, industrial, or agricultural use;
  - (D) does not have plumbing or electricity; { and }
    - <u>(E) is set back at least 300 feet from any river, stream, lake, or other body of water; and</u>
  - 178 {—(E)} registers with the local health department.
- 2. Page 7, Lines 188 through 194:
  - 188 <u>19-5-125.</u> Yurt exemption.
  - (1) As used in this section { "remote }
    - (a) "Backcountry waste containment and disposal system" means a pickle pail, rocket box, tube toilet, John-E partner, or similar container used to collect and carry out waste, including fecal matter.
      - (b) "Remote yurt" means the same as that term is defined in
  - 190 <u>Subsection 15A-1-204(12).</u>
  - 191 (2) A remote yurt is exempt from this chapter, rules made under this chapter, and local
  - health department's jurisdiction over onsite wastewater disposal, except that the owner of

- 193 remote yurt shall ensure that an individual using the remote yurt uses a backcounty waste
- 194 <u>containment and</u> {<u>removal</u>} disposal system.
