Mr. President,

The Transportation, Public Utilities, Energy, and Technology Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **S.B. 224**, DEDICATION OF PUBLIC HIGHWAYS, by Senator T. Weiler, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 18 through 20:
 - 18 provides that a property owner's interruption of a right-of-way created after
 - 19 dedication has no effect on the validity of the state's <u>or local highway authority's</u> claim to the right-of-way;
 - 20 removes certain limitations regarding the applicability of the dedication and
- 2. Page 3, Lines 73 through 78:
 - 73 (8) (a) The dedication and abandonment creates a right-of-way held by the state _ or a local highway authority in
 - 74 accordance with Sections 72-3-102, 72-3-104, 72-3-105, and 72-5-103.
 - 75 (b) A property owner's interruption under Subsection (4) of a right-of-way held by the
 - 76 <u>state</u> <u>or local highway authority</u> <u>in accordance with Subsection (8)(a) has no effect</u> on the validity of the state's <u>or local highway authority's</u> <u>claim to</u>
 - 77 the right-of-way and does not return the right-of-way to private ownership or use.
 - 78 (9) The scope of [the] <u>a</u> right-of-way <u>described in Subsection (8)(a)</u> is that which is
