	(1) Utah extends an invitation to the Navajo Nation, the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, the

cor	mmittee for the purpose of exploring the feasibility, location, functions, and other important
ma	tters surrounding the creation of a visitor center at Bears Ears.
	(2) As used in this section:
	(a) "Advisory committee" means the Bears Ears Visitor Center Advisory Committee
cre	ated by this section.
	(b) "Bears Ears" means the Bears Ears National Monument.
	(3) (a) Subject to Subsection (3)(b), there is created the Bears Ears Visitor Center
Ad	visory Committee consisting of the following eight members:
	(i) five voting members as follows:
	(A) a representative of the Navajo Nation, appointed by the Navajo Nation;
	(B) a representative of the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, appointed by the Ute Mountain
Ute	e Tribe;
	(C) a representative of the Hopi Nation, appointed by the Hopi Nation;
	(D) a representative of the Zuni Tribe, appointed by the Zuni Tribe; and
	(E) a representative of the Ute Indian Tribe of the Uintah Ouray, appointed by the Ute
Ind	ian Tribe of the Uintah Ouray; and
	(ii) subject to Subsection (4), three nonvoting members as follows:

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57	(A) one member of the Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate; and
58	(B) two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
59	House of Representatives.
60	(b) The advisory committee is formed when all of the tribes described in Subsection
51	(1)(a)(i) have communicated to the other tribes and to the Division of Indian Affairs that the
52	tribe has appointed a member to the advisory committee.
63	(4) At least one of the three legislative members appointed under Subsection (3)(a)(ii)
54	shall be from a minority party.
65	(5) The advisory committee may select from the advisory committee members the chair
66	or other officers of the advisory committee.
67	(6) (a) If a vacancy occurs in the membership of the advisory committee appointed
58	under Subsection (3), the member shall be replaced in the same manner in which the original
59	appointment was made.
70	(b) A member appointed under Subsection (3) serves until the member's successor is
71	appointed and qualified.
72	(7) (a) A majority of the voting members of the advisory committee constitutes a
73	quorum.
74	(b) The action of a majority of a quorum constitutes an action of the advisory
75	committee.
76	(8) (a) The salary and expenses of an advisory committee member who is a legislator
77	shall be paid in accordance with Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Legislative
78	Compensation and Expenses.
79	(b) An advisory committee member who is not a legislator may not receive
30	compensation or benefits for the member's service on the advisory committee, but may receive
31	per diem and reimbursement for travel expenses incurred as an advisory committee member at
32	the rates established by the Division of Finance under:
33	(i) Sections 63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107; and
34	(ii) rules made by the Division of Finance pursuant to Sections 63A-3-106 and

86	(9) The advisory committee may invite the United States Forest Service, the Bureau of
87	Land Management, the Division of Parks and Recreation, and the Utah Office of Tourism
88	within the Governor's Office of Economic Development, to serve as technical advisors to the
89	advisory committee.
90	(10) The Division of Indian Affairs shall staff the advisory committee.
91	(11) The advisory committee shall study and make recommendations concerning:
92	(a) the need for a visitor center associated with Bears Ears;
93	(b) the feasibility of a visitor center associated with Bears Ears, including investigating:
94	(i) potential locations for the visitor center;
95	(ii) purposes for the visitor center; and
96	(iii) sources of funding to build and maintain the visitor center;
97	(c) whether a visitor center will increase visitorship to Bears Ears; and
98	(d) whether a visitor center at Bears Ears could function as a repository of traditional
99	knowledge and practices.
100	(12) The advisory committee may contract with one or more consultants to conduct
101	work related to the issues raised in Subsection (11) if the Legislature appropriates money
102	expressly for the purpose of the advisory committee contracting with a consultant.
103	(13) The advisory committee shall hold at least one public hearing to obtain public
104	comment on the creation of a Bears Ears visitor center.
105	(14) The advisory committee shall report the advisory committee's recommendations to
106	one or more of the following:
107	(a) the Economic Development and Workforce Services Interim Committee;
108	(b) the House Economic Development and Workforce Services Committee; or
109	(c) the Senate Economic Development and Workforce Services Committee.
