Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **17-50-501** is amended to read:

17-50-501. Classification of counties.

(1) Each county shall be classified according to its population.

(2) (a) A county with a population of [700,000] <u>1,000,000</u> or more is a county of the first class.

(b) A county with a population of [125,000] <u>175,000</u> or more but less than [700,000] <u>1,000,000</u> is a county of the second class.

(c) A county with a population of [31,000] 45,000 or more but less than [125,000] 175,000 is a county of the third class.

(d) A county with a population of 11,000 or more but less than [31,000] 45,000 is a county of the fourth class.

(e) A county with a population of 4,000 or more but less than 11,000 is a county of the fifth class.

(f) A county with a population less than 4,000 is a county of the sixth class.
