28	<u>76-10-3201.</u> Definitions.
29	As used in this section:
30	(1) (a) "Commercial social networking website" means a person who operates a
31	website that allows a person to register as a user for the purpose of:
32	(i) establishing a personal relationship with one or more other users through direct or
33	real time communication with the other user; or
34	(ii) the creation of web pages or profiles available to the public or to other users.
35	(b) "Commercial social networking website" does not include an electronic mail
36	program or a message board program.
37	(2) (a) "Identifying information" means information that alone or in conjunction with
38	other information identifies an individual.
39	(b) "Identifying information" includes an individual's:
40	(i) name;
41	(ii) date of birth;
42	(iii) phone number;
43	(iv) unique biometric data, including the individual's fingerprint, voice print, or retina
44	or iris image;
45	(v) unique electronic identification number, address, routing code, or financial
46	institution account number;
47	(vi) telecommunication identifying information or access device; and
48	(vii) social security number or other government issued identification number.
49	Section 2. Section 76-10-3202 is enacted to read:

51	(1) It is a criminal offense for a person to use the name or persona of an individual:
52	(a) without the individual's consent;
53	(b) (i) to create a web page on a commercial social networking website or other
54	website; or
55	(ii) to post or send a message on or through a commercial social networking website or
56	other website, other than on or through an electronic mail program or message board program;
57	<u>and</u>
58	(c) with the intent to harm, defraud, intimidate, or threaten any individual.

59	(2) It is a criminal offense for a person to send a communication by electronic mail,
60	instant message, text message, or similar means, if:
61	(a) the communication references identifying information belonging to an individual;
62	<u>and</u>
63	(b) the person sends the communication:
64	(i) without the individual's consent;
65	(ii) with the intent to cause a recipient of the communication to reasonably believe that
66	the individual authorized or sent the communication; and
67	(iii) with the intent to harm or defraud an individual.
68	(3) (a) An offense described in Subsection (1) is a third degree felony.
69	(b) An offense described in Subsection (2) is:
70	(i) a class A misdemeanor; or
71	(ii) if the person commits the offense with the intent to solicit a response by emergency
72	personnel, a third degree felony.
73	(4) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that the person is one of the
74	following entities or that the person's conduct consisted solely of action taken as an employee
75	of one of the following entities:
76	(a) a commercial social networking website;
77	(b) an Internet service provider;
78	(c) an interactive computer service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. Sec. 230;
79	(d) a telecommunications provider, as defined in Section 10-1-402;
80	(e) a cable television service; or
81	(f) an entity that provides cable television service, as defined in Section 10-18-102.
82	(5) Prosecution under this part does not prevent a prosecution under any other law.
