74	(a) a list of each type of personal identifying information collected, used, or disclosed;
75	(b) the statutory authority for collecting, using, or disclosing the personal identifying

77	(c) a description of how the personal identifying information is used by the government

79	(d) a list of each entity, and a general description of the category of individuals, with
80	which the government agency shares the personal identifying information;

83	(f) a list of each misuse or improper disclosure of personal identifying information by
84	or from the government agency during that year, including for each:

92	(a) within 30 days after the day on which the state auditor receives a report described in
93	Subsection (1), post the report on the state auditor's website; and
94	(b) on or before January 31 each year, post on the state auditor's website a list of each
95	government agency that did not timely comply with the requirements of this section for the
96	preceding year.
97	(4) Except for an annual report submitted in 2021, a government agency shall include
98	in each annual report any information that was not included in the preceding year's report
99	because the event occurred too late to be included in the preceding year's report.
