	Section 1. Section 9-7-205 is amended to read:
	9-7-205. Duties of board and director.
	(1) The board shall:
	(a) promote, develop, and organize a state library and make provisions for [its] the state
	<u>library's</u> housing;
	(b) promote and develop library services throughout the state in cooperation with other
	state or municipal libraries, schools, or other agencies wherever practical;
	(c) promote the establishment of district, regional, or multicounty libraries as
	conditions within particular areas of the state may require;
	(d) supervise the books and materials of the state library and require the keeping of
	careful and complete records of the condition and affairs of the state library;
	(e) establish policies for the administration of the division and for the control,
(distribution, and lending of books and materials to those libraries, institutions, groups, or
	individuals entitled to them under this chapter;
	(f) serve as the agency of the state for the administration of state or federal funds that
	may be appropriated to further library development within the state;
	(g) aid and provide general advisory assistance in the development of statewide school
	library service and encourage contractual and cooperative relations between school and public
	libraries;
	(h) give assistance, advice, and counsel to all tax-supported libraries within the state
	and to all communities or persons proposing to establish a tax-supported library and conduct
	courses and institutes on the approved methods of operation, selection of books, or other
	activities necessary to the proper administration of a library;
	(i) furnish or contract for the furnishing of library or information service to state
	officials, state departments, or any groups that in the opinion of the director warrant the
	furnishing of those services, particularly through the facilities of traveling libraries to those

(j) where sufficient need exists and if the director considers it advisable, establish and

73	(1) As used in this section:
74	(a) "Digital access" means access to an Internet connection and computing device.
75	(b) "Digital divide" means the difference between the opportunities and resources
76	available to individuals who have digital access and individuals who lack digital access.
77	(c) "Digital equity" means the condition of individuals and communities having the
78	capacity and sufficient resources for full participation in the economy, democracy, and society.
79	(d) "Digital literacy" means an individual's ability to find, evaluate, and compose clear
80	information through the use of information and communication technology.
81	(e) (i) "Information and communication technology" means technology related to
82	digital access.
83	(ii) "Information and communication technology" includes:
84	(A) hardware;
85	(B) the Internet;
86	(C) broadcast technology other than the Internet; and
87	(D) software.

89	(i) a desktop computer;
90	(ii) a laptop computer;
91	(iii) a smartphone; or
92	(iv) a tablet.
93	(g) "Program" means the Digital Equity Program created in this section.
94	(2) There is created within the division the Digital Equity Program, administered by the
95	director of digital equity.
96	(3) (a) The director of digital equity, under the general supervision of the division
97	director, shall direct the program.
98	(b) The director of digital equity shall have experience in digital literacy or other
99	experience related to addressing the digital divide.
100	(4) The director of digital equity shall seek to accomplish the following objectives
101	through administration of the program:
102	(a) promoting digital access, digital literacy, and digital safety;
103	(b) in coordination with the Governor's Office of Economic Development and the Utah
104	Education and Telehealth Network described in Section 53B-17-105, promoting the
105	development of broadband Internet and soliciting input on strategies to increase access to and
106	the adoption of broadband Internet;
107	(c) providing statewide strategic leadership and coordination related to digital access;
108	<u>and</u>
109	(d) building the local capacity to increase digital access and digital literacy.
110	(5) The program shall target the activities described in Subsection (4) to individuals
111	most affected by the digital divide, including individuals who:
112	(a) live in rural areas;
113	(b) have disabilities;
114	(c) are senior citizens;
115	(d) are Native Americans;
116	(e) have economic barriers to digital resources;
117	(f) are homeless; or
118	(g) are refugees.

119	(6) When developing methods and partnerships necessary to accomplish the objectives
120	described in Subsection (4), the director of digital equity shall seek the expertise and input of
121	the Governor's Office of Economic Development and other stakeholders and community
122	partners including:
123	(a) the telecommunications industry;
124	(b) the Utah Education and Telehealth Network;
125	(c) the Utah State Board of Education;
126	(d) school districts;
127	(e) the Department of Transportation;
128	(f) the Legislature;
129	(g) the judiciary;
130	(h) local government;
131	(i) the disability advocacy community; and
132	(j) advocates for low-income housing.
133	(7) The division shall provide administrative services to the program.
134	(8) To accomplish the objectives described in Subsection (4), the division shall:
135	(a) make rules in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative
136	Rulemaking Act; and
137	(b) enter into agreements with and coordinate the activities of government agencies,
138	the Governor's Office of Economic Development, the Utah Education and Technology
139	Network, the Department of Transportation, and other entities as necessary to carry out the
140	program.
