	Section 1. Section 26A-14-1.5 is enacted to read:
	<u>26A-14-1.5.</u> Crisis services Reimbursement.
	The Department shall submit a waiver or state plan amendment to allow for
reimbu	rsement for 988 services provided to an individual who is eligible and enrolled in

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29	Medicaid at the time this service is provided.
30	Section 2. Section 62A-15-120 is enacted to read:
31	<u>62A-15-120.</u> 988 Suicide Prevention and Crisis Services Account Creation
32	Administration Permitted uses.
33	(1) There is created a restricted account within the General Fund known as the "988
34	Suicide Prevention and Crisis Services Account," consisting of:
35	(a) money appropriated or otherwise made available by the Legislature; and
36	(b) contributions of money, property, or equipment from federal agencies, political
37	subdivisions of the state, or other persons.
38	(2) (a) The division shall disburse funds in the 988 account only for the purpose of
39	support or implementation of 988 services or enhancements of those services in order to rapidly,
40	efficiently, effectively, and with greater interoperability deliver 988 services in the state.
41	(b) Funds distributed from the 988 account to county local mental health and substance
42	abuse authorities for the provision of crisis services are not subject to the 20% county match
43	described in Sections 17-43-201 and 17-43-301.
44	(c) The division shall prioritize expending funds from the 988 Restricted Account as
45	follows:
46	(i) the Statewide Mental Health Crisis Line, as defined in Section 62A-15-1301,
47	including coordination with 911 emergency service, as defined in Section 69-2-102, and
48	coordination with local substance abuse authorities as described in Section 17-43-201, and
49	local mental health authorities, described in Section 17-43-301;
50	(ii) mitigation of any negative impacts on 911 emergency service from 988 services;
51	(iii) mobile crisis outreach teams as defined in Section 62A-15-1401, distributed in
52	accordance with rules made by the division in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah
53	Administrative Rulemaking Act;
54	(iv) behavioral health receiving centers as defined in Section 62A-15-118;
55	(v) stabilization services as described in Section 62A-1-104; and
56	(vi) mental health crisis services provided by local substance abuse authorities as
57	described in Section 17-43-201 and local mental health authorities described in Section
58	17-43-301 to provide prolonged mental health services for up to 90 days after the day on which
59	an individual experiences a mental health crisis.
60	(3) Subject to appropriations by the Legislature, the division may expend funds in the

63	(4) The division director shall submit and make available to the public a report before
64	December of each year to the Behavioral Health Crisis Response Commission as defined in

67	(a) the amount of each disbursement from the restricted account described in Section

73	(d) the anticipated expenditures from the restricted account described in this chapter for

75	(e) the amount of any unexpended funds carried forward; and
76	(f) other relevant justification for ongoing support from the restricted account created by

78	Section 3. Effective date.
79	If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect
80	upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah
81	Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto, the
